Camp Constitution co-founder, friend and mentor Charlie Everett went home to be with the Lord July 31st of last year.

I first met Charlie at the John Birch Society's old headquarters in Belmont, MA back in the Spring of 1989. In 1990, I worked for him as a coordinator while he served as the National Director of Field Activities. He taught me some valuable things which served me well in my 26 years on the staff of the Society.

I had the pleasure of visiting the home of Charlie and his family on many occasions. In December of 2008, I got word that the Society's camp program was canceled. Charlie was the first I called after getting the news of the camp program's demise. I asked him if he would like to be a part of our own camp program. He immediately agreed. He was living in Rindge, NH at the time just a few miles from Toah Nipi where we held our camps from 2009 to 2017.

Charlie did all of the work necessary for our camp to become a New Hampshire charitable trust. Charlie served as Camp administrator. His duties included processing the camp applications, doing most of the camp banking, communicating with our donors and camp families throughout the year, and preparing the camp's annual report to the State of New Hampshire. If you attended our annual family camp, you were sure to get a birthday card from Charlie. He had help from his wife Linda and his daughter Elizabeth who serves as our treasurer. In 2011, Charlie and Linda relocated to Charlotte, NH but they would travel to New Hampshire to help with the camp's first few days.

Camp Constitution will always honor the memory of Charlie, and his valuable contributions he made to help make Camp Constitution possible and successful.★

She has a master's degree in Curriculum Development and a Bachelor of Science in Technology Education. She is a Sunday School Superintendent and a Sunday School Teacher.★




Mr. Alex Newman

Mr. Kurt Hyde was born in Texas in 1945, and raised in Connecticut. He joined The John Birch Society in March 1965 during his sophomore year in college.

After graduating from college with a degree in Physics in 1967, he went to Air Force Officer Training School and was commissioned as a second lieutenant. He earned a master's degree in Systems Management while on active duty.

He left the active-duty Air Force in 1976 and joined the Air Force Reserves in 1977 and retired in 1990 at the rank of lieutenant colonel. His primary duties were as a navigator, but he also served as Missile Launch Officer and as an Aircraft Maintenance Officer.


In civilian life, he became a computer professional. He started as a programmer and worked his way up to becoming a systems analyst and a database administrator. He occasionally taught computer science courses as an adjunct faculty member. In that capacity, he led his systems-analysis students in a study of a computerized voting booth in 1985 and 1986. He presented his findings at a symposium in Boston on August 14, 1986, where he recommended that computerized voting equipment should have a voterverified paper trail to ensure the computer did as the voter instructed. In October 2000, he co-wrote an article for The New American similarly warning of the dangers of Internet voting.

After retiring in 2011 he became a full-time John Birch Society volunteer and has written numerous articles for The New American, many of them dealing with election integrity. He accepted an appointment to the JBS Council in October 2016.★

Did I read that right?

Yes there are daily cabin inspections. Obviously, the inspectors are looking for clean and tidy quarters, however, the returning campers will show you how to really rack up the points. Traditionally, the campers who most creatively capture the spirit of our camp through theme based decorations, tasteful humor, and patriotism score big in the contest. Make it fun! Hint: The inspectors are not above the occasional bribery attempt.

Points from 0-10 are awarded each day for your participation in this contest. At the end of the week the cabin with the most points will get "FREE PIZZA" during the pizza party.

Newspaper Participation

The newspaper is looking for lecture reviews, free-time fun stories, campfire tidbits, lake-front occurrences etc. Who, what, where, how, why and when are the concepts to keep in mind as you write your stories. The newspaper always needs details on the following recurring events: Flag participants including Scripture reading and grace before meals. Also, don't forget polar bear, morning run, and campfire participants. We also want to see direct quotes from our speakers. Your team should have at least one per day.

Your cabin will earn 0-2.5 points each day for your submissions during the week. Your participation will require submissions from multiple campers on multiple topics. Quality, quantity, number of submitters and diversity of topics are the four criterion on which your bonus will be awarded each day. If multiple cabins cover the same topics, the Editor of the newspaper may combine the stories and weave the details but credit will be awarded whether the story is used or not. The bonus is 20% of your total points. Make sure all newspaper submissions have your name and cabin number on them so your team gets credit for the contribution. The bonus will be a running total updated daily and disclosed at the end of the week.

The newspaper bonus is often a difference maker.




