Field Trip: Calvin Coolidge Homestead



The President Calvin Coolidge State Historic Site in Plymouth Notch preserves the birthplace and childhood home of Calvin Coolidge, the 30th President of the United States. Brought to the world's attention on August 3, 1923, when Calvin Coolidge took the presidential oath of office in the parlor of his family home, the historic village appears much as it was during Coolidge's lifetime. The homes of the Coolidge family, their relatives, and friends edge the small village green, joined by the 1840 church, 1890 school house and cheese factory, pre-1835 store with post office and dance hall, and historic agricultural structures and barns. The bucolic image is completed by the 1924 Summer White House office and the tourists' cabins constructed in 1927 for the first of many visitors making the pilgrimage to explore the rural environs that shaped Coolidge's life and those of his ancestors who first settled here in the 1780s. A Museum & Education Center, added in 1972 and enlarged in 2010, houses the exhibits and archives recounting Calvin Coolidge's private and public lives. Visitors to the President Calvin Coolidge State Historic Site will also enjoy two museum stores, walking trails, and sheltered picnic area. A journey to the Notch ends at the steep hillside cemetery where Calvin Coolidge rests amongst seven generations of his family.

Creation of the President Calvin Coolidge State Historic Site began in 1947, when the State of Vermont purchased the Wilder House and Barn. Wilder House, built about 1830 as a tavern, was the childhood home of President Coolidge's mother, Victoria Josephine Moor. This first of several rehabilitation projects at Plymouth Notch provided visitors with an information center and lunch room. The Wilder Barn was restored to include an agricultural exhibit and public accessibility was improved at the Plymouth Notch Cemetery, which is owned by the town. Urged by the public and following the wishes of Grace Coolidge, John and

who added the front porch and 2-story front bay. Today, the Coolidge Homestead is furnished exactly as it was when Vice President Calvin Coolidge took the oath of office following the unexpected death of President Warren G. Harding. Over the next 40 years, the State of Vermont obtained ownership of the major parcels of land and significant buildings comprising the village to ensure preservation of Plymouth Notch as Calvin Coolidge remembered it. This was a vision begun just a month after the former president's death in 1933.

In 1960, the Calvin Coolidge Presidential Foundation was formed by John Coolidge and fellow Coolidge enthusiasts. Headquartered at Plymouth Notch, the Foundation is dedicated to preserving the legacy and promoting the values of America's 30th president. The Foundation owns and maintains the Union Christian Church, which was constructed in 1840 in the heart of the village. The church was gifted in 1970 to the Foundation by the congregation to ensure preservation of the building within the Village of Plymouth Notch Historic District.

That is Final: The Revolutionary-era Ideals that Shaped Calvin Coolidge

- The 150th anniversary commemorations of the American Revolution in the 1920s were colored by victory in World War I. Americans, whether on the home front or warfront, had fought for many of the same values as the rebelling colonists – the defense of liberty, equality, self-government, representation, and patriotism. These ideals also appeared in unifying speeches given by President Coolidge at events marking the anniversaries of Revolutionary War milestones.

This special exhibit explores excerpts of President Coolidge's speeches and explores instances when Revolutionary-era ideals were demonstrated in Coolidge's administration. Visitors will learn about self-government through the Teapot Dome scandal, and how tax reductions were liberating, for example. The exhibit will include a display of Revolutionary-era munitions and artifactual remnants unearthed at the Mount Independence State Historic Site in Orwell, Vermont.

"That is Final" will be on display from May 2025 through October 2027. ★

Stopping the CO₂ Pipeline

New 2025 Documentary – Review by Selwyn Duke

UNearthing the CO₂ Pipeline, by Stand Your Ground Studios, The John Birch Society, 2025, 54 minutes, DVD.

Is it “carbon capture” — or property rights, cash, and Constitution capture? This is the question explored, and answered, by the alarming new documentary UNearthing the CO₂ Pipeline. Produced by The John Birch Society and released on Earth Day (April 22), it warns of a man-made peril beneath the earth, one that could be coming to a town near you.

What is carbon capture (CC)? Grok AI puts it very succinctly, writing that it “is a process that traps carbon dioxide (CO₂) emissions from sources like power plants, industrial facilities, or directly from the air, preventing it from entering the atmosphere. The captured CO₂ is then stored underground, used in industrial processes, or converted into products.” The pretext for it is combating “global warming,” “climate change,” “global climate disruption,” or whatever the nom du jour will be when this essay is published. Of course, CO₂ — regularly called “carbon,” which is like calling water “hydrogen” — is implicated in this repentthe-end-is-nigh, doomsayer scenario. Never mind that botanists pump the gas into their greenhouses because it facilitates plant growth. (Crop yields rise notably along with CO₂ levels.) Never mind that astrobiologist Jack O’Malley-James predicted in 2013 that life on Earth would end due to too little CO₂ (albeit in a billion years). Never mind that Bjørn Lomborg of the Copenhagen Consensus Center has predicted that lowering Earth’s temperature one-third of one degree by this century’s end would cost \$100 trillion (which still may be lower than our national debt in 2100). Never mind that even the liberal New York Times admitted in 2016, reporting on a Lancet study, that “cold weather is responsible, directly or indirectly, for 17 times as many deaths as hot weather.” And never mind that some scientists believe another ice age is approaching. There’s carbon and cash to capture.

The carbon-capture pipeline (CCP) is a massive undertaking, too. The Department of Energy says 96,000 miles of CCP in the United States will be required to help meet Net Zero goals. Farmers in the Great Plains are even now battling a proposed \$8.9 billion, 2,100 -mile project. Even more significantly, it is setting propertyrights precedents that, turning the “man’s home is his castle” principle on its head, could affect Americans coast to coast and from here to eternity.

Now, while Grok’s CC definition may sound innocuous enough, UNearthing (UNE) explains that the pipeline scheme is anything but. It involves capturing CO₂ from industrial sources, compressing it, and then sending the “semi-liquid” hundreds of miles to an underground “amalgamation” area in North Dakota.

The term “compressed” can get your attention. It sure got mine, reminding me of the can of Coke I left in my freezer too long (I’d wanted to cool it down quickly; I was a Coke addict at the time). Upon very gentle removal — I handled it like nitroglycerin — the ill-fated can exploded like a grenade. It created the kind of mess that after a long day’s work would, were I not the testosterone-oozing culture warrior you know and love, have evoked tears. And sure, this may rightly bring a chuckle at my expense; unfortunately, when a CO₂ pipeline can’t take the pressure, the result isn’t even slightly comedic. This brings us to a story. While CO₂ is a naturally occurring, life-giving gas, it can do more when compressed than just create schmutz. Just consider the Lake Nyos disaster. Lake Nyos in Cameroon, Africa, is a deep, volcanic crater lake that on August 21, 1986 suddenly released a huge cloud of CO₂. Because the gas is heavier than oxygen, it displaced the latter. The result was

that 1,700 people and countless animals suffocated to death in short order. Note here that the CO₂ had long been present in the lake’s cold depths in, loosely put, a compressed state — much like it will be in the CCP. So does such a pipeline sound like a disaster waiting to happen?

It already has.

UNE recounts a fateful day in February 2020 when a CO₂ pipeline ruptured in the town of Satartia, Mississippi. Much as in Cameroon, people saw the ominous cloud and couldn’t breathe; some collapsed in their homes, experiencing symptoms such as dizziness, nausea, disorientation, convulsions, and unconsciousness. If you were driving at the time, that didn’t help you because cars stalled out (combustion requires oxygen). Note, too, that it took *four and a half hours* for the pipeline to empty.

Ultimately, at least 45 people were hospitalized, and hundreds had to be evacuated. No, it wasn’t a Lake Nyos-level disaster but, well, “‘We got lucky,’ said Yazoo County Emergency Management Agency director Jack Willingham,” reported the Freesoil Foundation in 2024. “‘If the wind blew the other way, if it’d been later when people were sleeping, we would have had deaths.’” The foundation also points out that CO₂ “has long been used to euthanize laboratory rodents and other small animals” (though many now consider this inhumane). So its angel-of-death potential is well known.

Oh, and what caused the pipeline to burst? It was “normal seasonal flooding.”

The kicker:

The pipe ruptured again while being repaired just months later — necessitating yet another evacuation. This isn’t surprising, as UNE informs that there are no federal regulations on CO₂ pipelines. Moreover, the CCP would be grandfathered in and not subject to *new safety regulations*.

This said, all human endeavor involves risk, and energy production-related matters are no exception. For example, accidents related to electricity generation from coal and oil account for 43 deaths per year, according to Our World in Data, but how many lives are saved annually by the same? The cost-benefit analysis is clear. But what of carbon capture and storage’s (CCS’s) risk? Does a cost-benefit analysis justify it?

Apropos here, environmentalist Nigel Calder warned in 1974 that the “threat of a new ice age must now stand alongside nuclear war as a likely source of wholesale death and misery for mankind.” Now, UNE points out that global-warming doomsayers’ prognostications have likewise been found wanting, causing them to rely instead on prevarication and ploy. For example, it talks about a certain legislative Trojan horse used to fund CCS. The documentary also illustrates how even fully effected the endeavor wouldn’t be effective; why, it quotes warmist hell-raiser Al Gore himself throwing shade on it. In fact, both Left and Right agree that CCS won’t lower temperatures, so where’s the benefit?

And why is it full steam ahead?

Well, follow the money. UNE reveals, too, who’s collecting our tax dollars through CCS (to the tune of billions), providing numbers and naming names. And how are these greentopian greenback chasers facilitating their business?

Well, hit films have been made, such as *Shane* (1953) and *Pale Rider* (1985), about powerful, greedy, big-money interests using strong-arm tactics to drive the little guys from their land. UNE exposes how the company building the CCP, Summit Carbon Solutions, has embraced this

spirit — only, using not warfare but lawfare. It basically makes property owners, often ranchers and farmers, an offer “they can’t refuse”: Play ball with us, or we’ll use eminent domain and do whatever we want.

UNE also reveals how state and some county governments, and judges, have been complicit in this, and how Summit will go nadir-low to achieve its ends. It preys on the vulnerable: widows, the weak, even a man suffering dementia. It uses bullying tactics and intimidation, threatening counties with legal action and even suing the deceased.

And once Summit gets what it wants, an easement or lease, it’s the best of both worlds — for the company. That is, the landowners still pay the property taxes, but the company now has some control over the property. You may need their permission to build on the pipeline area; you may not be allowed to target shoot on your own land; and if, let’s say, your tractor sinks a few feet in wet earth and disrupts the pipe line, you may be liable for any damages and deaths. In a nutshell, it’s like a species of fascism: The land is still privately owned, but the company, abetted by the government, has some hold on it.

UNE provides, of course, many more details. The work is also replete with interviews with ranchers, farmers, and government officials, thus putting human faces on the oppression — and its opposition. The documentary explains as well, for example, how Summit

- is draining deep aquifers, necessary for agriculture, and how its actions could render that water impotable;
- destroys underground drainage systems;
- removes good food-producing land from agricultural use; and
- will use the liquefied CO₂ for fracking despite promising it wouldn’t.

We also learn from UNE how the feds dealt with greentopian climate policy’s unpopularity: Not at all constrained by the truth-in-advertising imperative, the government incentivized CC tech via the Inflation Reduction Act, which provided companies “cash in hand.”

As bad as CCS is, however, even worse, asserts UNE, is that it’s merely part of a much larger agenda than even just the fantastic goal of achieving “net zero” by 2050. Thus does the documentary also answer the following questions:

- How many decades of CCS “projects” are planned?
- What is “Agenda 2030,” how does CCS intersect with it, what are its 17 goals, and what policy initiative is it masquerading as in the United States?
- What are “30 by 30” and “50 by 50,” and how do they enter the equation?
- What are the “15-minute cities” greentopians want us all sardine-canned into?
- Is this really about the technocratic control and regionalization of government, the removal of private property rights, the undermining of individual liberties, the centralization of the food supply, and the “own nothing, be happy” principle?
- Does the agenda even include attaining control over “what, when, and how you buy?”

That last bullet point sounds, of course, quite biblical. That is, the Book of Revelation warned nearly 2,000 years ago that a time would come when no one would “be able to buy or to sell, save he that hath the mark, either the name of the beast or the number of his name.” While this sounds ominous, however, don’t run for the Prozac just yet, because UNE offers one more thing: hope.

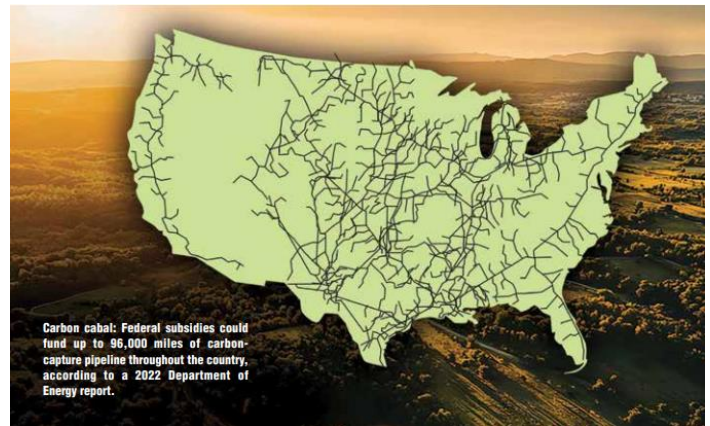
The work explains how South Dakotans dealt CCS a blow via a referendum, and that Summit has had to delay the CCP’s start-up date because of grassroots opposition. UNE also outlines how you can get



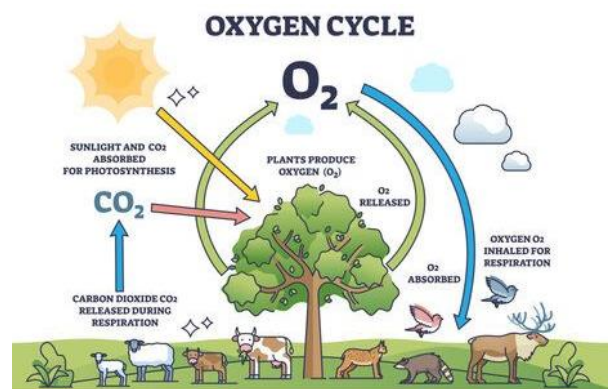
involved, fight the good fight, and become another David helping to slay Goliath. It really is quite inspirational.

UNE is also very smartly made, polished, captivating, and cohesive, with no perceptible cinematic hamburger helper; there are no wasted words. One segment segues so beautifully to the next that it’s sometimes hard to even conceptualize them as segments. The work moves quickly but is not rushed, is informationally sating but not overwhelming. The documentary is 54 minutes long.

UNE will alarm you, then arm you as it reminds us of a simple truth: You may not care about politics, but politics sure does care about you. If we’re not vigilant, someday soon it may not be just America’s purple mountain majesties that take our breath away.



Nature’s Carbon Capture



"In 2022, the S&P 500 energy sector ended the year a whopping 59 percent higher than where it started, amid a brutal bear market, in which the S&P 500 overall lost 20 percent. If you are invested in ESG in 2022, you are a massive loser because you are divested from energy. Stop the politicization of capital!"

Yet Biden vetoed the measure.

How could this mindset affect us once CBDC erases cash? Will we be allowed gas money for cars, or be forced to drive electric vehicles?

Will we be permitted to purchase beef or other foods with supposed "high carbon" footprints?

In other areas: Will we have funds for medical care if we aren't fully vaxxed and boosted? For the imprudence of posting a belief in only two genders on social media, will we be banned from online transactions? In the aftermath of a school shooting, will we be able to purchase ammunition?

It is telling that proponents of ESG also push CBDC, and they admit to exploiting the coercive potential of both. "The amount of ESG information being made available by rating agencies, technology firms, and auditing and consulting firms has exploded," raves the Strategic Intelligence arm of Klaus Schwab's World Economic Forum (WEF), "and efforts are afoot to bring more coherence and consistency to it through standards and regulation."

It's the same WEF that seven years ago made "8 predictions for the world in 2030," the first of which blatantly states, "You'll own nothing. And you'll be happy." And in its plug for CBDC as a protection against financial crimes, WEF admits the tracking features of digital dollars, which will "improve transparency of money flows," unlike cash, which "is essentially untraceable."

Another CBDC cheerleader and WEF partner is the Bank for International Settlements (BIS) headquartered in Basel, Switzerland. It is the bank of central banks and operates outside the jurisdiction of any government, enjoying profits that are tax-free. It encourages both ESG and CBDC through its Innovation Hubs on "green finance" and digital currencies, respectively.

Speaking at an International Monetary Fund seminar in 2020, BIS general manager Agustín Carstens summed up the essential benefit of CBDCs, noting that "the central bank will have absolute control on the rules and regulations that will determine the use of that expression of central bank liability, and also we will have the technology to enforce that."

Global Currency

Once this tyrannical control is established, BIS's next step is worldwide CBDC "interoperability," the industry's tongue-twister for seamless cross-border movement of money. The New American's Charles Scaliger described it as "a sort of 'free-trade agreement' for currencies," though, admittedly, free-trade agreements "so often turn out to be pretexts for international government blocs such as the European Union."

Indeed, BIS was behind the 2002 launch of the euro, which forced European countries to forfeit their ability to conduct independent monetary policy.

Today, CBDCs amount to a steppingstone from national and regional currencies



to the internationalist dream of a global currency. In its July 2022 Report to the G20, the BIS details its efforts toward "factoring an international dimension" into CBDCs. The wording echoed that of a January 2022 report by the Federal Reserve Bank entitled Money and Payments: The U.S. Dollar in the Age of Digital Transformation, which discussed "cross-jurisdictional collaboration" and "international coordination to address issues such as common standards and infrastructure."

Meanwhile, such would-be financial despots disparage private cryptocurrencies and stablecoins. Though these digital assets are already used worldwide, their decentralized

platform threatens central-bank control over the financial world.

Hence, promoters of CBDC belittle crypto as volatile. They fail to differentiate between the industry pioneer Bitcoin (developed specifically to privatize money and prevent censorship) and copycats such as TerraUSD (a U.S. dollar-based stablecoin) and FTX (a cryptocurrency exchange), which are privately owned but centrally controlled and have introduced digital Ponzi schemes into the mix.

The collapse last year of several such industry newcomers has left pundits speculating whether their demise was intentional, to set CBDC up as a savior to protect hapless crypto investors from future catastrophe. This year's failure of several large banks has only added fuel to the fire, with analysts predicting that government seizures will establish an effective banking monopoly, allowing them to then roll out CBDC.

In her analysis of the Silicon Valley Bank collapse in March, financial commentator Kim Iversen said that what is really happening is "the consolidation of smaller banks into the larger ones," to force tech and crypto "into banks under the thumb of those ushering in" CBDC and social credit scores. "If you can control tech and crypto," says Iversen, "you can control the people."

Elites are well on their way. On its CBDC tracker, the Atlantic Council records 11 countries that have already launched a CBDC, while 90 others are in planning phases.

The good news is that opposition is growing. Florida's Republican governor Ron DeSantis recently signed legislation to practically ban a CBDC in Florida, should the U.S. government authorize one. A similar bill has been enacted in Indiana, and a somewhat weaker bill has been signed in Arkansas. Similar legislation is currently working its way through several other state legislatures, including Alabama, Ohio, and South Carolina. North Carolina's House of Representatives unanimously passed a bill in May prohibiting state offices from accepting CBDC payments. South Dakota Republican Governor Kristi Noem vetoed a bill that would have authorized CBDC, and banned crypto competitors. Texas legislators have introduced measures in both the House and Senate to establish a state digital currency backed by gold.

On Capitol Hill this year, House Majority Whip Tom Emmer (R-Minn.) introduced the CBDC Anti-Surveillance State Act, to block the Fed from rolling out its digital currency, and Texas Republican U.S. Senator Ted Cruz authored a bill with the same goal.

More legislators at both the state and federal levels must follow suit and support measures to pull the plug on this Deep State assault on our financial freedom. ★
