Dr. Michael Coffman received his BS in Forestry, his MS in Biology, and his Ph.D. in Forest Science. He has been has been a respected scientist and ecologist for over thirty years in both academia and industry.

Until 1992 Dr. Coffman was a manager for Champion International, a leading forest and paper products company. Dr. Coffman is currently president of Environmental Perspectives, Inc. (EPI) and executive director of Sovereignty International. EPI focuses on providing professional guidance and training in defining environmental problems and solutions based on Judeo-Christian princples of stewardship.

Dr. Coffman has written two books, Saviors of the Earth? The Politics and Religion of Environmentalism and Rescuing a Broken America; Why America is Deeply Divided and How We Can Heal it Constituionally. He has also made several DVD presentations: Global Warming or Global Governance and Global Warming, Emerging Science.



## History of the Barrett Farmhouse

During today's trip to Concord, some of the families were able to have a somewhat impromptu visit to the the Barrett Farmhouse which was a few minutes past the Concord Bridge park area. This farmhouse was purchased in 2005 from its private owners by the *Save our Heritage* organization to be restored and instated into the Minuteman National Park.

The Barrett Farmhouse was Colonel James Barrett's house during the time of the Revolutionary War. Col. Barrett, who commanded the colonial militia, stored most of the Massachusetts weapons and munitions in his house. Because of this, the Barrett Farmhouse was the key target of the British expedition which caused Paul Revere to go on his famous midnight ride alerting the townspeople of the British's intentions.

As a result of the Farmhouse's rich history, it is listed in the National Register of Historic Places as a site of national significance and Save Our Heritage is excited to have it become a museum in the National Park in 2013

## Bethel 3:


