THE ★ INCOME ★ TAX

The income tax is based on Marxian principles that subvert the legitimate function of civil government. In his Second Treatise on Government, the English theorist John Locke correctly summarized the legitimate function of civil government by asserting: "The chief end, therefore, of men's uniting into commonwealths, and putting themselves under government, is the preservation of their property." James Madison revealed that this Lockean concept was shared by America's Founding Fathers when he declared: "Government is instituted to protect property of every sort... This being the end of government, that alone is a just government, which impartially secures to every man, whatever is his own..."

In *The Communist Manifesto*, published in 1848, Karl Marx boldly asserted: "... the theory of the Communists may be summed up in the single sentence: abolition of private property." Marx also wrote: "You are horrified at our intending to do away with private property. Precisely so: that is just what we intend."

VAXXED: FROM COVER-UP TO CATASTROPHE



Vaxxed is an outstanding documentary. It is about the CDC lying and committing fraud in the MMR autism study. The main producer and writer is Dr. Andrew Wakefield who has been researching the correlation between autism and the MMR study since the 1990s. One of the other producers Dr. Brian Hooker received a call from CDC scientist Dr. William Thompson. Over a period of several months Dr. William Thompson confided in Dr. Hooker and led him through the obfuscation. One quote from the movie reports "I can't believe we did what we did, but we did." The movie shows how the CDC deviated from their analysis plan and altered and falsified their findings. Once you lock in your analysis plan, you aren't supposed to deviate from it. But they did. They were studying a number of kids; they cut that number in half. The analysis plan also required all children in the study to have a Georgia birth certificate. Only about half of the kids left had a Georgia BC. After the study was completed the scientists who had worked on it sat around and had a "shredding party". They all shredded their documents except one, Dr. Thompson. That is how we really know about the MMR fraud. It also carefully laid out and showed they would lose \$30B each year if the MMR vaccine was pulled.

Dr. Thompson methodically shows how if you get the MMR on the CDC recommended schedule your chance of getting Autism goes up by 700%. If you wait just a year it goes down to almost nothing. Back in the early 2000's Dr. Wakefield stumbled on a link between MMR and autism. . **(Continued Page 4)**

Marx listed ten measures that should be adopted by the countries of the world. He prefaced this list with the following statement: "These measures will of course be different in different countries. Nevertheless, in the most advanced countries, the following will be pretty generally applicable." The second measure Marx advocated was: "A heavy progressive or graduated income tax."



This is exactly what was fastened on America by the Sixteenth Amendment. ★

WHAT ★ IS ★ MONEY?**What Is Money?**

Money is simply a medium of exchange. As a store of value, money may be traded for goods or services, which allows for commerce to flourish. A person buys money when he sells his goods or services; and he sells money when he buys goods or services.

Once money is universally accepted, it spurs commerce, allows for a wide diversification of labor, stimulates productivity, fills the need for a measure of value, and advances civilization. Without money, people must resort to the impreciseness of bartering, which hampers commerce.

Sound Money Characteristics

History clearly indicates that good money has these characteristics: (1) divisibility, (2) transportability, (3) durability, and (4) relative scarcity. Gold and silver both fit these qualifications. In fact, gold has been employed as money for at least 3,000 years. Money should be a commodity valued for its own properties aside from its use as money, unlike the paper money now in use.

Constitutional Money

Regarding money, the Constitution grants the following powers to Congress in Article I, Section 8:

"To coin money, regulate the value thereof, and of foreign coin, and fix the standard of weights and measures; To provide for the punishment of counterfeiting the securities and current coin of the United States."

The founders intended "to coin money" to mean taking precious metal and stamping it into coinage for use as a medium of exchange. Article I Section 10:

"No State shall ... coin money; emit bills of credit; make anything but gold or silver a tender in payment of debts...."

Thus, the Constitution clearly states that the only permissible legal tender is gold and silver money. ★

LOCAL ★ POLICE ★ Part 1**A Check Against Tyranny**

There are an estimated 12,575 local police departments in the United States. The United States is one of the few countries in the world that has a locally controlled law enforcement system managed by locally elected officials at the town, city, and county level.

The jurisdictional overlap of the many local police departments and various other law enforcement agencies is an essential component of the checks and balances that have made this country a free and prosperous republic for over 200 years.

Locally controlled police are the hallmark of a free society. Ultimately, there are just two types of police. The first is locally controlled police. The second is nationally controlled police, who serve the national government, not the citizens.

A Police State In America?

The United States is virtually unique in that it has not turned its system of local law enforcement into a national police force. But for one moment, imagine how the transformation would occur if it were to happen here.

In order for our nation's state and local police to be nationalized, an array of transitional steps, such as the following, would be needed.

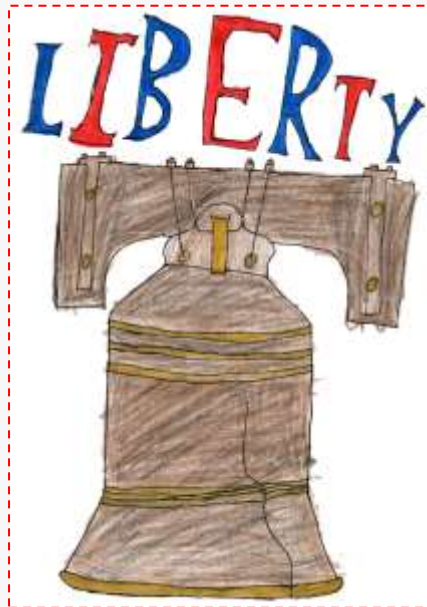
1. **CRISIS.** Real or fabricated, a crises would provide for the acceptance of "solutions" to perceived threats that would otherwise be unacceptable to society.
2. **AID.** Incapable of dealing with the crisis, local police would accept aid from the military or in the form of funding, grants, and equipment from the federal government. This would eventually translate into the permanence of the "helping hand" of the federal government followed by controls.
3. **LEGISLATION.** New crisis-targeting laws would be passed. These would place requirements on local law enforcement to adopt measures that would overturn the traditional role of police as local servants and protectors of the community and/or that would also ignore longstanding constitutional limitations and protections. Discontent would slowly develop, fostering animosity between the people and the government.
4. **PROPAGANDA.** A propaganda campaign would be started by radical groups to discredit local law enforcement. Incidents would also be exploited to depict all policemen as "brutal" or "racist."
5. **INDOCTRINATION.** As all of this would be happening, the federal government would begin training local police to respond to and prevent future crises, similar to the initial one. This federal training would have two main goals: (1) train local police how to use (and rely) on equipment and tactics coming from the federal government, and (2) indoctrinate local police with information from the federal government about individuals labeled "extremists" or "domestic threats."
6. **IMPLEMENTATION.** Eventually, the local police, for all practical purposes, would become an arm of a national police force beholden, not to the people, but to the national government. The people would become conditioned to believe in the need for greater federal government control over their lives and local police.
7. **NATIONALIZATION.** At this point, a true national police force would become a reality. Local police departments would be assimilated into a national police force. ★

He then released a statement that said you should have single vaccines. Just the M, M, and the R. After he did that the single vaccines were banned.

Before 1983 (when the Vaccine Injury Act was passed) they were only about 6 vaccines they recommended. That act passed released the vaccine manufacturers from all liability. To get compensation from vaccines you have to go to a special court called, "Vaccine Court." Instead of the companies paying you, the taxpayers are forced too. 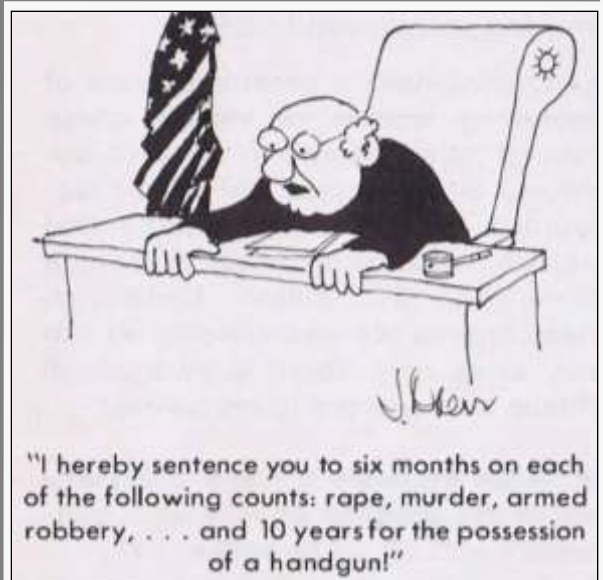



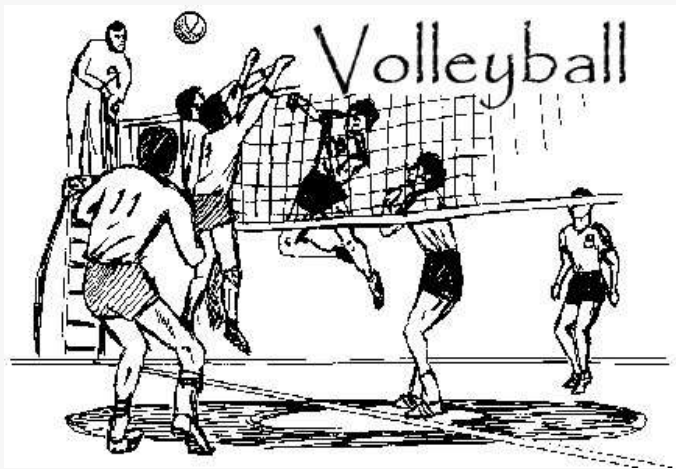
