


Vernacular Farmhouse with Bungalow elements. Wood frame set on post and block foundation; rectangle (20'x36') with flat roof addition on north facade; 2 bays wide; 1½-stories; wood shake siding with wood shingles on gable ends; wood-shingled gable roof with extended eaves; off-center entrance on south facade with glass and wood-panelled door; exterior end chimney on west facade. Exterior features include 2/2-pane fixed sash; metal sliding sash; 2/1, 4/1, 6/1, 8/1, 6/6 double-hung sash all with moulded surrounds; gable-roofed portico on south facade supported by plain posts; 3-sided bay window on west facade; knee braces; exposed rafter ends; plain fascia board. Notable landscape features include 2 wood frame gable-roofed outbuildings; orchard remnants. This farmhouse was built by Charlie Mitchell c. 1900, who lived here for many years. The house was later bought by Glen Darst, a potato farmer. Glen never lived in the house, opting to rent out the house and farm the land. The house was passed to Glen's son Gerald in 1948, and he lived here with his family until he sold the house c. 1979 to Dr. Palmetter. 1995: The house does not have integrity due to alterations, but the born is a contributing structure in the cultural landscape.
