Farmhouse Residence Vernacular Farmhouse with Bungalow elements. Wood frame set on stone and post foundation; T-shape (18' x 42'); 1-story; shiplap siding; wood-shingled hip roof with extended eaves; pedimented entrance with decorative door on east facade; corbelled center chimney. Exterior features include 1/1, 2/2, 6/6 double-hung sash with plain surrounds; lozenge-shaped panes/1 fixed sash; tri-partite window with single pane fixed sash; prominent hip-roofed dormer on south facade with 4-pane casement sash; arched overhang supported by decorative knee braces; plain fascia board; 1-story, gable-roofed, board and batten addition on north facade; wood shingle skirting. Notable landscape features include 3 wood frame outbuildings, 1 in ruins; 2 large, gable-roofed chicken houses, west of house. Art Holmburg owned this house from about 1905 until the 1920's. He was a builder, and may have built this for himself. Glenn Darst bought the place in the 1920's. Darst had a turkey business in the 1930's, and the large structures to the west of the house were hen houses, now used to store bulbs. 1995: One contributing building and three contributing structures.
