Vernacular Barn. Wood frame set on post and block foundation; rectangle (41' x 27'); 3 bays wide; shiplap siding; metal-covered gambrel roof with hay hood; entrances on all facades. Exterior features include 4-pane hinged sash with plain surrounds; extended eaves with exposed rafter ends; corner boards. Notable landscape features include 3 wood frame outbuildings; large remnant orchard.

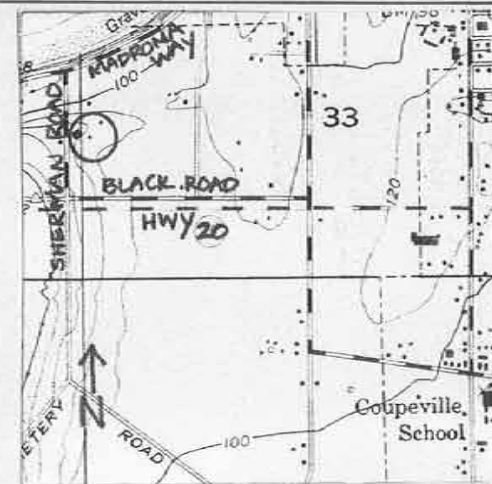
Old Art Black owned this property and lived in a "bachelor cabin" located in the orchard (no longer standing). After he passed away in the 1930's, Dr. Bishop bought the property (c. W.W.II). Bishop's children inherited the place and sold to Jeffers.

1995: 3 contributing structures.

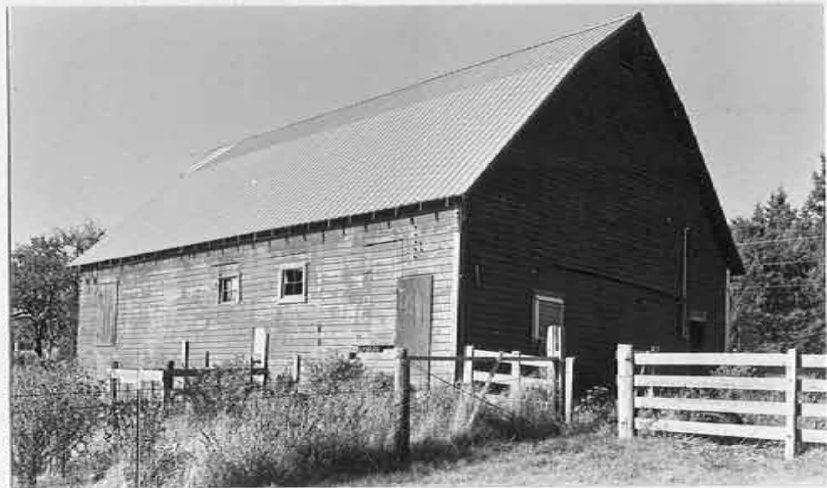
SIGNIFICANCE
This property is significant under National Register criterion A, for its association with agricultural land use patterns first established during the period of early settlement in the 1850s. It retains integrity of location, setting, materials, design, workmanship, feeling and association.
