Notable landscape features include 1 wood frame, hip-roofed outbuilding; remnant orchard in yard. John Leach, local businessman, built this house in 1883 and used it as the Headquarters Saloon as well as his personal residence. In 1886, Coupeville became a "dry" town and the liquor license for the Headquarters Saloon was revoked. Calista Kinney Lovejoy married Leach in 1880, and the house is still owned by a member of the Lovejoy family today. It is now used as a seasonal residence. 1995: Property was subdivided after 1983 and orchard was removed. One contributing building and one contributing structure.
