Exterior features include 1/1 double-hung sash; 3-pane fixed sash with plain surrounds; wood shutters on front facade; plain cornice; plain frieze board; sloping roof line on north facade; front stairs with wood railing to plate glass door on east facade, This house was built for Carl Gillespie c. 1903 by the Coates brothers. The building was originally located across Main Street at the site of the Courthouse Annex. The building was used as office space for many years prior to its relocation. Mr. Downing moved the structure to its present location in 1972 when construction began on the Annex. Many changes have been made to both the interior and exterior of the structure: the porch across the front facade has been removed and the house sits higher off the ground than originally. 1995: One contributing building; one competible structure. 
