Exterior features include 2/2 double-hung sash with plain surrounds; boxed cornice; plain frieze board with carved brackets; corner boards; hip roof porch with extended eaves, exposed rafter ends and square posts across south facade; wood panel double door with 2-pane window. Exterior features include picket fence around building; location of building as part of the Jacob Jenne property. O.S. Van Olinda, a realtor, built this structure in 1905 on Front Street. He sold it to Dr. White, a dentist. Following his marriage to Berthe Jenne about 1910, Dr. White moved the building to its present location behind the Jenne House, and continued his dental practice there. 
SIGNIFICANCE
