DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND HISTORY INCLUDING CONSTRUCTION DATE(S), PHYSICAL DIMENSIONS, MATERIALS, MAJOR ALTERATIONS, IMPORTANT BUILDERS, ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, ETC.

False Front Commercial Building. Wood frame set on post and block foundation; rectangle (20' x 30'); 2 bays wide; 1-story; shiplap siding; wood-shingled gable roof; off-center entrance on south facade; off-center interior chimney on west facade. Exterior features include 2/2 double-hung sash with plain surrounds; boxed cornice; plain frieze board with carved brackets; corner boards; hip roof porch with extended eaves, exposed rafter ends and square posts across south facade; wood panel double door with 2-pane window. Exterior features include picket fence around building; location of building as part of the Jacob Jenne property.

O.S. Van Olinda, a realtor, built this structure in 1905 on Front Street. He sold it to Dr. White, a dentist. Following his marriage to Berthe Jenne about 1910, Dr. White moved the building to its present location behind the Jenne House, and continued his dental practice there. The building is now the private residence for the owners/managers of the Victorian House Bed and Breakfast.
