This bungalow was built in 1920 for E. J. Hancock, who moved there from his farm. In 1928, the house passed on to											
Edith Hancock Pearson. She sold the structure to Charles Dixon in 1930. Members of the Dixon family occupied the house											
until it was sold to "Aunt Pat" Partridge in 1946. Aunt Pat had been the owner of Pat's Place Restaurant and Hotel for											
many years which is located across Main Street. Aunt Pat maintained a large rose garden in the front yard of the house											
for many years. Roberta Lee inherited the house in 1965. For several years, the house was used as a rental home and since 1979, the Community Alcohol Center has occupied the building. The rose garden and picket fence around the front											
yard have been removed but few changes have been made to the exterior of the structure.
