DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND HISTORY INCLUDING CONSTRUCTION DATE(S), PHYSICAL DIMENSIONS, MATERIALS, MAJOR ALTERATIONS, IMPORTANT BUILDERS, ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, ETC. <u>Queen Anne Residence. Wood frame set on stone/concrete foundation; L-shape (24' x 44') with 1-story, gable roof addition on west facade; 4 bays wide; 2-stories; asbestos shingle siding with octagon and square butt wood shingles on the gable ends; wood-shingled gable roof with cross gable; off-set front entrance on east facade; corbelled interior chimney on north facade. Exterior features include 1/1 double-hung sash with corner blocks and molded surrounds; decorative cornice with plain frieze board; decorative stickwork with dentils, sawtooth and sunburst motifs in gable ends; decorative clipped corners beneath eaves on east projections; steep, hipped-roof, 2-story, square tower in ell with finial; 1-story, hipped-roof porch on east facade; dentils and quatrefoil motif in screen beneath porch eaves; decorative porch posts with fan-shaped brackets and stickwork railing; wood panel door with single pane fixed sash; corner boards; wood sill; enclosed porch on south facade; small enclosed porch on north facade. Notable landscape features include 4 gable roof outbuildings.</u> <u>1995: Outbuildings removed; new garage built (1991); one contributing building; one compatible structure</u> <u>In 1890, Ed Jenne purchased a four acre plot near Prairie Center and had a house constructed for his retirement. The house was sold to Will Jenne in 1908. The house remained in the Jenne family until it was sold to Mattie and Ivar Powell in 1950. The house was sold again in 1967 and since then has had several owners.
