They constructed the addition on the east facade. In 1951, the house was sold to the Barretts. Since that time, the windows have been replaced, the front door moved from farther north on the same facade, and the original siding covered with composition siding. The barn located on the property pre-dates the house. The Barretts still reside in the house. 1995: New owners have rehabilitated the building; new windows added, non-historic siding removed; one contributing building; two contributing structures.
