Exterior features include 1/1 double-hung sash with plain surrounds; extended eaves with exposed rafter ends; plain frieze; corner boards; small gable roof porch supported by square posts and plain railing on west facade; wood panel door with single pane window; wood sill. Notable landscape features include I wood frame, gable roof outbuilding. Ben Lamphere constructed this house in 1917 for Ed Clark. He resided in the house for many years. In the 1960's, Mrs. Barbara Slough purchased the house. The Bishop's moved into the house in 1978. The building was in poor condition at that time. A concrete foundation was constructed and the building was restored. 1995: One contributing building; one contributing structure.

SIGNIFICANCE

This property is significant under National Register criterion C, because it embodies the distinctive characteristics of architectural expressions and methods of construction that represent the period of community stabilization and economic slowdown (evidenced by simpler forms lacking ornamentation) and the theme of recreation and tourism (evidenced by structures built with natural materials set in scenic locations), from 1911 until 1945. It retains integrity of location, setting, materials, design, workmanship, feeling and association.
