DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND HISTORY INCLUDING CONSTRUCTION DATE(S), PHYSICAL DIMENSIONS, MATERIALS, MAJOR ALTERATIONS, IMPORTANT BUILDERS, ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, ETC.

Bungalow. Wood frame set on post and block foundation; rectangle (20' x 26') with 1-story hip roof addition on east facade; 3 bays wide; 1-story; clapboard siding; asphalt-shingled gable roof with extended eaves; center entrance on west facade; off-set, interior chimney on north facade. Exterior features include 1/1 double-hung sash with molded surrounds; knee braces; exposed rafter ends; fascia board; plain frieze board; hip roof porch with slightly battered posts across west facade; carved wood panel door with single pane window. Notable landscape features include beautiful landscaped yard and gardens; 1 wood frame gable roof outbuilding.

Tom Howell, a local barber, had this house constructed c.1915. Polly Harpole lived in the house in the early 1930's prior to establishing her maternity home on Haller Street. Mrs. Edith Wright has resided in the house for the last several years. There have been very few changes to the exterior of the structure.

SIGNIFICANCE

This property is significant under National Register criterion C, because it embodies the distinctive characteristics of architectural expressions and methods of construction that represent the period of community stabilization and economic slowdown (evidenced by simpler forms lacking ornamentation) and the theme of recreation and tourism (evidenced by structures built with natural materials set in scenic locations), from 1911 until 1945. It retains integrity of location, setting, materials, design, workmanship, feeling and association.

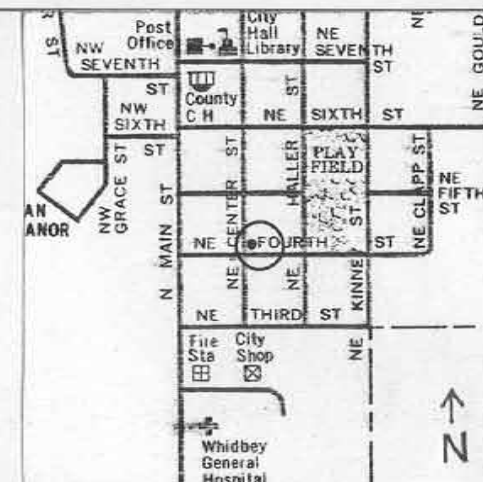
