Vernacular Farmhouse. Wood frame set on stone foundation; T-shape (32' x 28'); 5 bays wide; 1½-stories; shiplap siding; wood-shingled gable roof with extended eaves; off-center entrance on west facade; new, exterior end chimney on east facade. Exterior features include 1/1 double-hung sash; 1/1 hinged sash; 3-pane fixed sash; diamond-pane fixed sash; boxed cornice; plain frieze board; corner boards; 1-story, hip-roofed porch supported by turned posts and decorative brackets with stickwork screen beneath porch eave, on west facade; 1-story shed and hip-roofed addition on south facade; shed-roofed porch supported by turned posts on east facade. Notable landscape features include 1 board and batten-sided outbuilding; 1 clapboard-sided outbuilding; 1 wood frame chicken coop.

Mr. Strong lived in this house for years before he died c.1938. Strong and Ives were the local "morticians". Abe Hamlin owned it next and was the last person to farm the land. The house has had very few changes through the years. The present owners purchased the property in 1976.

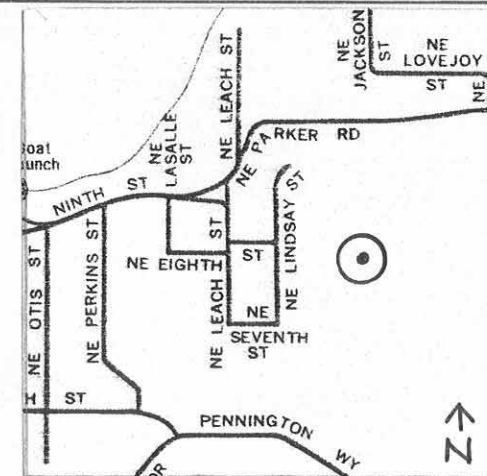
