DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND HISTORY INCLUDING CONSTRUCTION DATE(S), PHYSICAL DIMENSIONS, MATERIALS, MAJOR ALTERATIONS, IMPORTANT BUILDERS, ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, ETC. Vernacular Farmhouse. Wood frame set on post and block/concrete foundation; T-shape (20' x 28'); 1½-stories; clapboard siding; wood-shingled gable roof with cross gable on east facade; off-center entrance on north facade; off-center interior chimney. Exterior features include 1/1 double-hung sash with plain surrounds; 1-story gable-roofed square bay on north facade; boxed cornice; plain fascia boards; plain frieze boards; corner boards; roof slopes down to small gable-roofed overhang above entrance on north facade; multi-pane door; entrance on south facade opens on to patio; wood sill. Notable landscape features include 1 wood frame, gable-roofed outbuilding. Built circa 1900, this house was the Black family residence for many years. The house has been remodeled several times. The front entrance is no longer used and the main access to the house is through the door located on the south facade. 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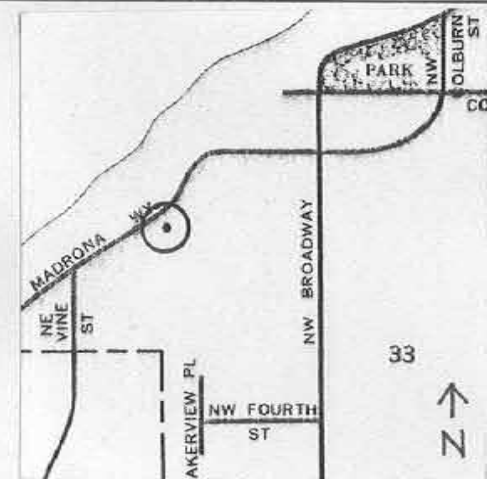
