

DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND HISTORY INCLUDING CONSTRUCTION DATE(S). PHYSICAL DIMENSIONS, MATERIALS, MAJOR ALTERATIONS, IMPORTANT BUILDERS, ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, ETC. Queen Anne Residence. Wood frame set on concrete block foundation; L-shape (28' x 26') with shed roof addition on south facade; 4 bays wide; 1 1/2-stories; shiplap siding with octagon wood shingles on gable ends; wood-shingled gable roof with extended eaves; off-set entrance on north facade; exterior chimney on west facade. Exterior features include 1/1 double-hung sash and leaded glass hinged sash with decorative surrounds; decorative cornice; plain frieze board; decorative stickwork in gable ends with sunburst motif; clipped corners with sunburst motif over bay window on north facade; hip roof porch in corner of ell with chamfered posts and stickwork railing, brackets; sunburst motif in wood panel of door with single pane fixed sash above; wood sill; lattice work skirting around porch; shed roof porch on west facade of similar design to front porch. This is one of several homes built by the Lovejoy Brothers who were local ship builders and home builders. It originally was the residence of E.O. Lovejoy. Additions have been made to the rear of the structure and the interior has been remodeled, but the front facade remains intact. 1915: One contributing building; one compatible structure.
