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False Front Commercial. Wood frame set on post and block foundation; rectangle (10' x 24'); 2 bays wide; 2-stories; shiplap siding with board and batten siding on 1 1/2-story south addition; asphalt-shingled gable roof with prominent center gable on false front; off-center entrance on north facade with 3-panel wood and glass door; interior end chimney on west facade. Exterior features include large single pane commercial sash with plain surrounds; 2/1 and 1/1 double-hung sash with plain surrounds; boxed cornice; plain frieze board; corner boards; cement steps with iron railing.

Lester Still purchased this parcel of land in 1905. In 1909, Mr. Straub constructed the building which was used as a law office. The building has housed a variety of businesses over the years but has retained its original appearance. As of 1983, there was no running water in the building.

SIGNIFICANCE

This property is significant under National Register criterion C, because it embodies the distinctive characteristics of architectural expressions and methods of construction that represent the period of community development in the Reserve, from 1871 until 1910.

This property is also significant under National Register criterion A, for its association with commercial enterprises which established a stable economic foundation for the community from the period of early settlement in the 1850s through 1945. It retains integrity of location, setting, materials, design, workmanship, feeling and association.

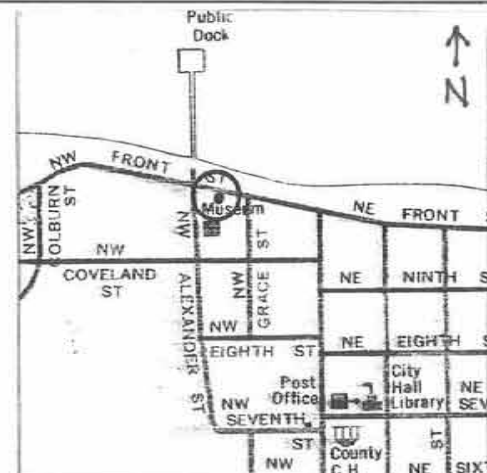
PHOTOGRAPHS AND SKETCH MAP OF LOCATION
