Notable landscape features include location of structure on bluff overlooking beach. This building was built in 1904 for John Samsel, an attorney. By 1906, James Zylstra, prosecuting attorney for Island County, owned the structure. It originally was half the present size with a false front, gable roof and carved brackets. The structure has been expanded in size and the roof line changed and it now serves as a private residence. 1995. One contributing building.
