DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND HISTORY INCLUDING CONSTRUCTION DATE(S), PHYSICAL DIMENSIONS, MATERIALS, MAJOR ALTERATIONS, IMPORTANT BUILDERS, ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, ETC.

Falsefront Commercial. Wood frame set on concrete foundation; rectangle (25' x 50') with shed-roofed addition on south facade; 3 bays wide; 1-story; painted brick block exterior; tar-papered gable roof with stepped falsefront on north facade; off-set plate glass door with transom on north facade. Exterior features include large, multi-pane fixed sash; flat roof canopy over gas pumps; hinged, double garage doors.

This building was constructed for Mr. Sorgenfrei. It originally was a Pontiac dealership. In recent years it has housed automobile garages and an antique store. It currently contains an automobile garage.

SIGNIFICANCE This property is significant under National Register criterion A, for its association with commercial enterprises which established a stable economic foundation for the community from the period of early settlement in the 1850s through 1945.

This property is also significant under National Register criterion C, because it embodies the distinctive characteristics of architectural expressions and methods of construction that represent the period of community stabilization and economic slowdown (evidenced by simpler forms lacking ornamentation) and the theme of recreation and tourism (evidenced by structures built with natural materials set in scenic locations), from 1911 until 1945. It retains integrity of location, setting, materials, design, workmanship, feeling and association.

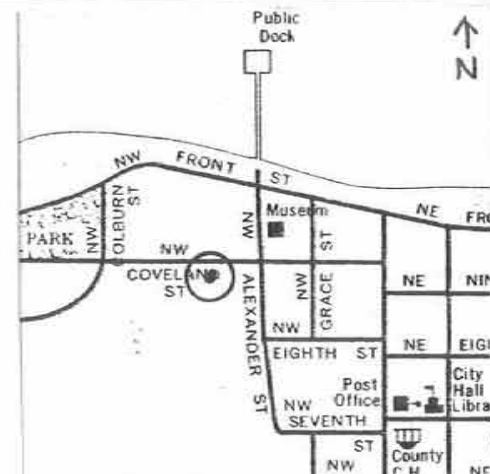
