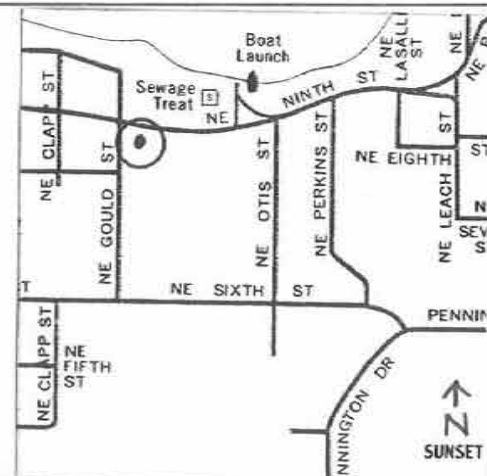

DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND HISTORY INCLUDING CONSTRUCTION DATE(S), PHYSICAL DIMENSIONS, MATERIALS, MAJOR ALTERATIONS, IMPORTANT BUILDERS, ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, ETC. Italianate Residence. Wood frame set on post and block foundation; square (26' x 26') with 1-story hip-roofed additions to south facade; 3 bays wide; 2-stories; shiplap siding; asphalt-shingled hip roof; center entrance on north facade; paired, corbelled interior chimneys. Exterior features include 2/2 double-hung sash with plain surrounds; 2-story bay windows with carved brackets, flanking entry on north facade; wide, bracketed cornice with plain frieze board; corner boards; hip-roofed porch with decorative brackets, chamfered posts and pilasters; wood panel door with stained glass transom; enclosed porch on east facade. Notable landscape features include 1 wood frame, gable roof and 1 wood frame, shed roof outbuilding. John Gould, a local farmer and public official, built this house in 1894 following his retirement from farming. The house remained in the Gould family for many years. Additions to the south facade have been made over the years and the porch on the east facade was enclosed. The structure was re-roofed in the 1960's due to damage from a house fire. Faye Heppard purchased the house in 1965 from Luther Weedon. The structure retains the integrity of the original design to a large degree.
