Exterior features include 2/2 double-hung sash with molded surround; plain frieze board; corner boards; shed roof dormer on north facade; hip-roofed porch with wood columns and carved brackets on north facade. Notable landscape features include 1 board and batten, gable roof outbuilding; 1 large black walnut tree. Captain Thomas Coupe settled on Whidbey Island in 1853, purchasing a Donation Claim on Penn Cove. He contracted with the Hill brothers to build a house. The building materials came from San Francisco and the house was constructed of redwood. The structure has been moved back on the property twice due to erosion of the bluff above the Cove. With the growth of Coupeville, the road which ran to the north of the house was moved farther south so now the building sits off the road among the trees and overgrowth. The Bruce family recently willed the house to Children's Orthopedic Hospital. The structure is currently occupied but in a very deteriorated condition. 1995: The house has been rehabilitated; one contributing boulding; one contributing atructure.
