



Vernacular Residence. Wood frame set on concrete foundation; rectangle (24' x 40'); 3 bays wide; 1½-stories; shiplap siding; wood-shingled gable roof with intersecting gable roof section on north facade; center entrance on north facade; 2 interior chimmeys. Exterior features include 1/1 double-hung sash with cornice; small panes above single pane fixed sash; 1-story bay with 1/1 double-hung sash on east facade; plain cornice and frieze board; corner boards; hip-roofed porch with cross gable; bays flanking recessed center entry on north facade; wood panel and glass door with transom; center front stairs with plain wood railing and squared posts; gable-roofed porch with plain wood posts and railing on west facade; enclosed hip-roofed porch across south facade. Notable landscape features include remnant apple orchard; long, cement walkway to street.  1995: One contributing building.  Chris Solid built this structure c. 1906. He farmed the surrounding area for many years and lived in the house until the 1940's. Mrs. Alsobrook had the building converted into a duplex in the late 1940's. It has now been reconverted into a single family residence and a new foundation was added in 1983. The outside appearance remains essentially intact, owned/by a relative of the Solid family.
