Built c.1905, this house has been extensively remodeled over the years. The structure originally had a wrap-around porch on the north and west facades and the door was located in the center of the north facade. During the 1930's, an addition was built on the south facade. The current owner purchased the house in 1957. Since that time a second addition has been built on the south facade, the west portion of the porch has been incorporated into the house, windows have been remodeled, and the front entrance moved. 1995: One contributing building; one non-contributing structure.
