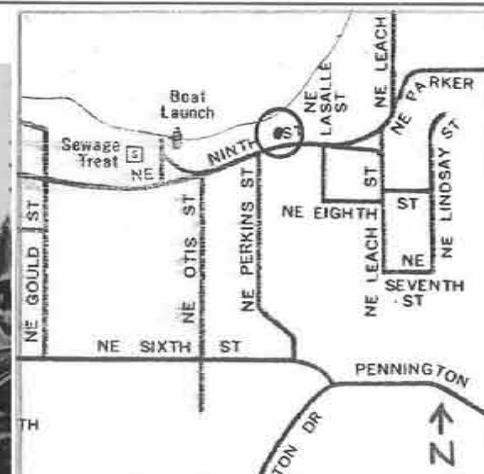

DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND HISTORY INCLUDING CONSTRUCTION DATE(S), PHYSICAL DIMENSIONS, MATERIALS, MAJOR ALTERATIONS, IMPORTANT BUILDERS, ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, ETC. Vernacular Residence. Wood frame set on post and block foundation; square (24' x 24') with 1-story gable roof additions on north and east facades; 1-story; shiplap siding; wood-shingled hip roof; off-center entrance on west facade. Exterior features include 1/1 and 2/2 double-hung sash with plain surrounds; aluminum sliding sash; gable roof bay on northwest corner; boxed cornice; plain, wide frieze board; hip roof porch with plain stickwork under eaves; plain wood posts and railing; enclosed shed roof porch extends length of addition on west facade; enclosed porch extends length of addition on east facade. Notable landscape features include location of house on bluff overlooking Penn Cove. <i>1995: One contributing building; one non-contributing structure.</i> Mr. Howard, editor of the Island County Times, was an early owner of this house. The original building was the square, hip roof section. Numerous additions have been made to the structure. By the early twentieth century the gable roof addition to the east had been constructed with an open porch overlooking Penn Cove. The house originally faced Front Street but the street eroded away into the Cove several years ago and now access to the house is from 9th Street. The Lindsey family lived in the house during the 1930-40's. The porch on the northeast facade has been enclosed and a bay window constructed. The current owners purchased the home in 1976.
