Early Bungalow. Wood frame set on post and block foundation; rectangle (20' x 26') with 1-story shed roof addition on east facade; 3 bays wide; 1-story; shiplap siding; wood-shingled hip/gable roof with extended eaves; off-center entrance on north facade; corbelled center chimney. Exterior features include 1/1 double-hung sash with plain surrounds; 1, single pane fixed sash with lozenge-shaped panes above; diamond-shaped window on gable end of north facade; exposed purlins and rafter ends; fascia board; corner boards; porch with wide, squared posts, plain railing and side stairs extending across north facade; wood panel door with large oval window; vertical wood panel skirting. 1995: one contributing building. This house was built c. 1900 as part of a small farm complex. The Gashill family lived in the house during the 1910-1920's. In 1944, the Vaugh family purchased the house. They were related to Chris Solid who had a small farm to the north-east of this complex. During the 1950's, the addition was constructed on the east facade and the barn torn down. Mrs. Vaugh sold the house to Jim Anderst in 1972. It is now a rental house. The original front door is still on the structure.
