Vernacular Farmhouse. Wood frame set on post and block foundation; rectangle (24' x 16') with 1-story gable roof addition on east facade; 2 bays wide; 1½-stories; asbestos shingle siding; asphalt-shingled gable roof; off-center entrance on north facade; center chimney. Exterior features include 6/1 double-hung sash; 2/2 double-hung sash with plain surrounds; plain cornice; pedimented portico supported by plain posts above boxed railing; enclosed hip-roofed porch on east facade. Notable landscape features include 1 wood frame, shiplap-sided outbuilding.

This house was built in 1896. It has been altered over the years with asbestos siding installed and windows covered over. Peggy Williams has owned the house since 1955.
