DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND HISTORY INCLUDING CONSTRUCTION DATE(S), PHYSICAL DIMENSIONS, MATERIALS, MAJOR ALTERATIONS, IMPORTANT BUILDERS, ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, ETC.

1930's Vernacular Residence. Wood frame set on post and block foundation; T-shape (38' x 16'); 4 bays wide; 1-story; clapboard siding; asphalt-shingled hip roof; off-set, recessed entrance with wood door and decorative window on north facade; battered, exterior stone chimney on east facade. Exterior features include 3 and 4-pane fixed sash with plain surrounds; stonework landing to front entrance; shed-roofed porch with exposed rafter ends on west facade leading to patio; hinged, double garage doors with 2-pane windows. Notable landscape features include the setting among Evergreen trees and landscaped yard.

Local contractor, Ralph Ward, built this house in 1938. The current owners, the Clarks, have lived in the house since 1941. The only exterior change to the structure has been the addition of a patio to the west. The exterior stone chimney was constructed by a local stone mason, of rocks picked up on Whidbey Island.

SIGNIFICANCE This property is significant under National Register criterion C, because it embodies the distinctive characteristics of architectural expressions and methods of construction that represent the period of community stabilization and economic slowdown (evidenced by simpler forms lacking ornamentation) and the theme of recreation and tourism (evidenced by structures built with natural materials set in scenic locations), from 1911 until 1945. It retains integrity of location, setting, materials, design, workmanship, feeling and association.
