

Exterior features include 1/1 double-hung sash; multi-pane sash; prominent gable-roofed dormer on north facade; enclosed porch with multi-pane sash on west facade with 5-panel door flanked by sidelights of lozenge-shaped panes/1/4-pane sash; exposed rafter ends; plain frieze board; fascia board. Notable landscape features include 1 wood frame gable-roofed outbuilding.  A local farmer and logger by the name of Ebert Thomas is said to have built this early bungalow.
