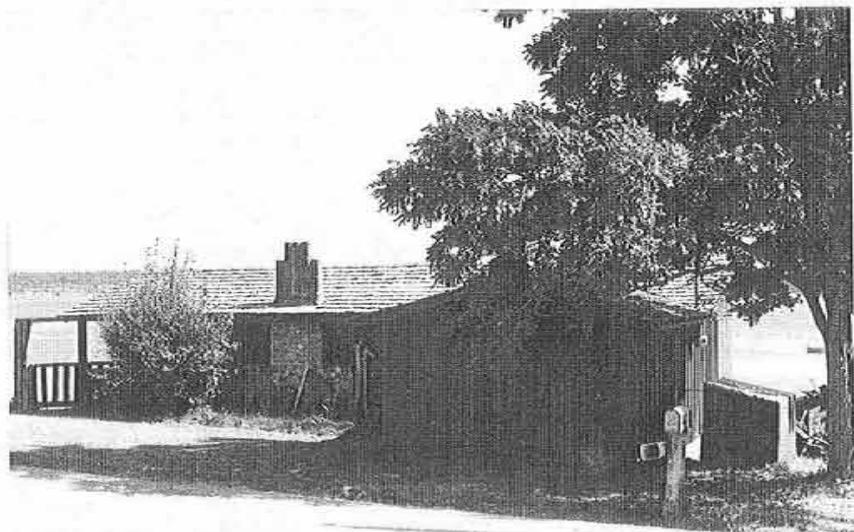

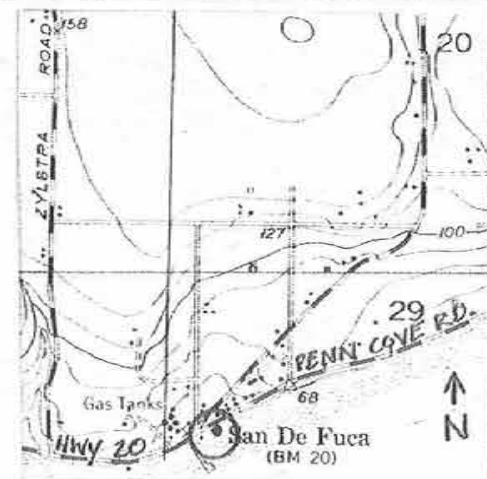

DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND HISTORY INCLUDING CONSTRUCTION DATE(S), PHYSICAL DIMENSIONS, MATERIALS, MAJOR ALTERATIONS, IMPORTANT BUILDERS, ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, ETC. Beach Cabin. Log construction set on concrete foundation; L-shape (30' x 16'); 1-story with daylight basement on south facade; horizontal round logs with vertical wood panelling on ell; wood-shingled gable roof; off-center entrance on east facade; exterior end, stepped stone chimney capped with tiles, on north facade. Exterior features include single pane fixed sash; aluminum sliding sash; gable end extends over porch with horizontal log railing and vertical wood railing on east facade; steep stairs to beach on east side of building. Notable landscape features include siting of structure on bluff, overlooking Penn Cove. Judge Still built this structure out of beach logs, sand, and cement, and lived in the structure for a few years. In the 1950's or 60's, the vertical panelled ell and basement were added. SIGNIFICANCE This property is significant under National Register criterion A, for its association with the important theme of recreation and tourism in the Reserve and represents a period of community development (1871-1910) followed by a period of economic stability (1911-1945). This property is also significant under National Register criterion C, because it embodies the distinctive characteristics of architectural expressions and methods of construction that represent the period of community stabilization and economic slowdown (evidenced by simpler forms lacking ornamentation) and the theme of recreation and tourism (evidenced by structures built with natural materials set in scenic locations), from 1911 until 1945. It retains integrity of location, setting, materials, design, workmanship, feeling and association.
