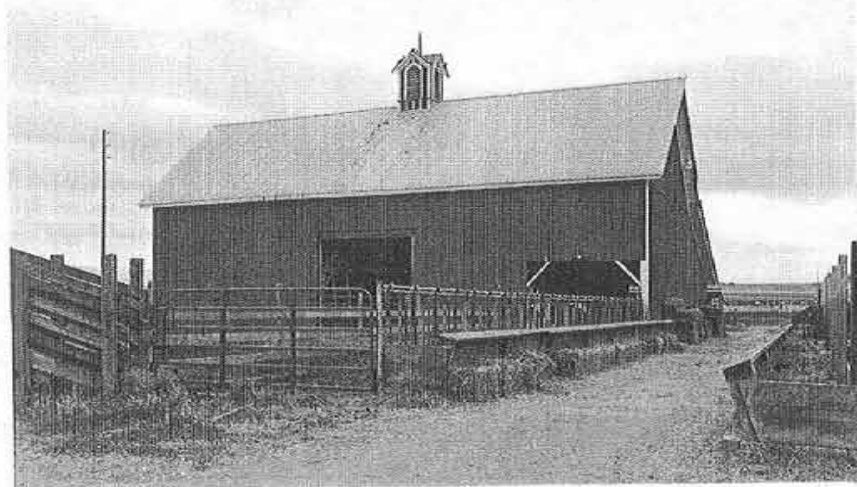

DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND HISTORY INCLUDING CONSTRUCTION DATE(S), PHYSICAL DIMENSIONS, MATERIALS, MAJOR ALTERATIONS, IMPORTANT BUILDERS, ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, ETC. Vernacular Barns. Grainery: wood frame set on concrete foundation; rectangle (30' x 60'); shiplap siding; wood-shingled gable roof with extended eaves and knee braces; 6 gable-roofed cupolas/vents along ridgeline; corner boards; wood sill. Barn: wood frame; rectangle (80' x 60'); board and batten siding; metal-covered gable roof with extended eaves and shed-roofed extension on south facade; decorative gable-roofed cupola in center; corner boards. These prominent outbuildings were built for John LeSourd who resided in the large house to the west along Ebey's Landing Road. The barn was built before 1900. 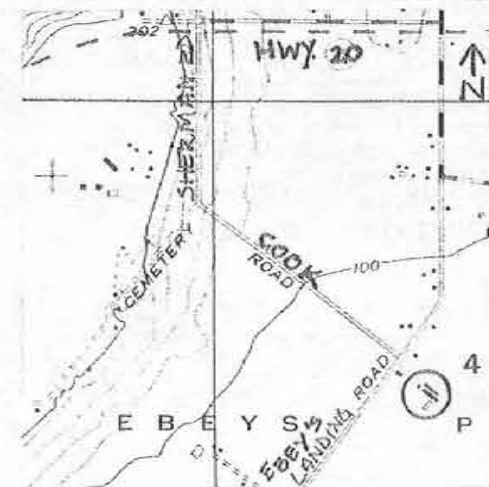
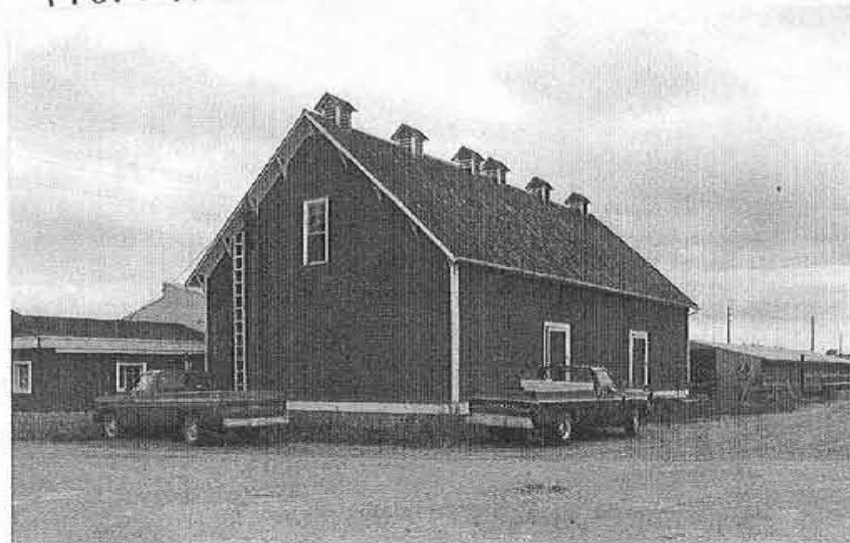
