Wood frame set on stone or concrete foundation; rectangle (30'x40'); 4 bays wide; 1½-stories; clapboard siding; slate-covered gable roof with cross gable running north/south; off-center entrances on south facade; paired interior corbelled chimneys. Exterior features include 3/3, 6/6 double-hung sash with plain surrounds; moulded boxed cornice with returns; moulded frieze board; corner boards; shed-roofed entrance porch with squared chamfered posts and pilasters or tuscan columns on squared bases and lattice skirting. Notable landscape features include 1 wood frame, gable-roofed outbuilding with addition now used as a residence.


These buildings were originally constructed by the government to house officers at the Fort Casey Military Reservation. The older duplexes have a stone foundation. The small residence to the west housed the military doctor, who was then only steps away from the infirmary (since razed). Hoenig purchased the property from the G.S.A. in 1955 after it was declared surplus. Julius Bluhm (Bloom?) was a partner with Hoenig, and moved the small building (east section of the property) in c. 1970's from either his farm or Coupeville. The complex is beautifully maintained.

SIGNIFICANCE This property is significant under National Register criterion A, for its association with the United States military operations in the Reserve, and represents a period of community development, 1871-1910, followed by a period of economic stability, 1911-1945, during which the military played a key role. It retains integrity of location, setting, materials, design, workmanship, feeling and association.


PHOTOGRAPHS AND SKETCH MAP OF LOCATION
