



DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND HISTORY INCLUDING CONSTRUCTION DATE(S), PHYSICAL DIMENSIONS, MATERIALS, MAJOR ALTERATIONS, IMPORTANT BUILDERS, ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, ETC. Military building with Colonial Revival elements: Duplex. Wood frame set on stone or concrete foundation; rectangle (30'x40'); 4 bays wide; 1½-stories; clapboard siding; slate-covered gable roof with cross gable running north/south; off-center entrances on south facade; paired interior corbelled chimneys. Exterior features include 3/3, 6/6 double-hung sash with plain surrounds; moulded boxed cornice with returns; moulded frieze board; corner boards; shed-roofed entrance porch with squared chamfered posts and pilasters or tuscan columns on squared bases and lattice skirting. 
PHOTOGRAPHS AND SKETCH MAP OF LOCATION
