

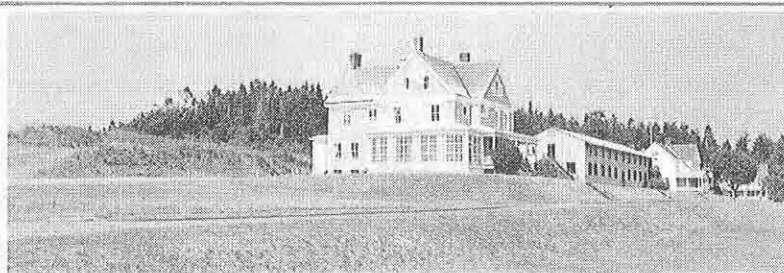

DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND HISTORY INCLUDING CONSTRUCTION DATE(S), PHYSICAL DIMENSIONS, MATERIALS, MAJOR ALTERATIONS, IMPORTANT BUILDERS, ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, ETC.  Colonial Revival Residence (1906). Wood frame set on stone foundation; cross shape; 4 bays wide; 2½-stories; clapboard siding; slate-covered gable roof with multiple cross gables; off-center entrance on south facade; 3 corbelled chimneys. Exterior features include 2/2 double-hung sash; Palladian window on south facade; dentillated cornice; multi-pane enclosed porch on west facade; porch across south facade supported by tuscan columns and decorative railing.  Military Auditorium (1906). Wood frame set on raised brick foundation; rectangle; 3 bays wide; 1½-stories; clapboard siding; slate-covered gable roof; center entrance with classical portico on east facade. Exterior features include 6/6 double-hung sash with cornice above; decorative round window with keystones; moulded cornice with returns.  Military Firehall (1907). Wood frame set on stone foundation; rectangle with square tower; 2 bays wide; 1-story; clapboard siding; slate-covered gable roof; large, double entrance doors on west facade; corbelled interior end chimney on south facade. **SIGNIFICANCE** This property is significant under National Register criterion A, for its association with the United States military operations in the Reserve, and represents a period of community development, 1871-1910, followed by a period of economic stability, 1911-1945, during which the military played a key role. It retains Integrity of location, setting, materials, design, workmanship, feeling and association.

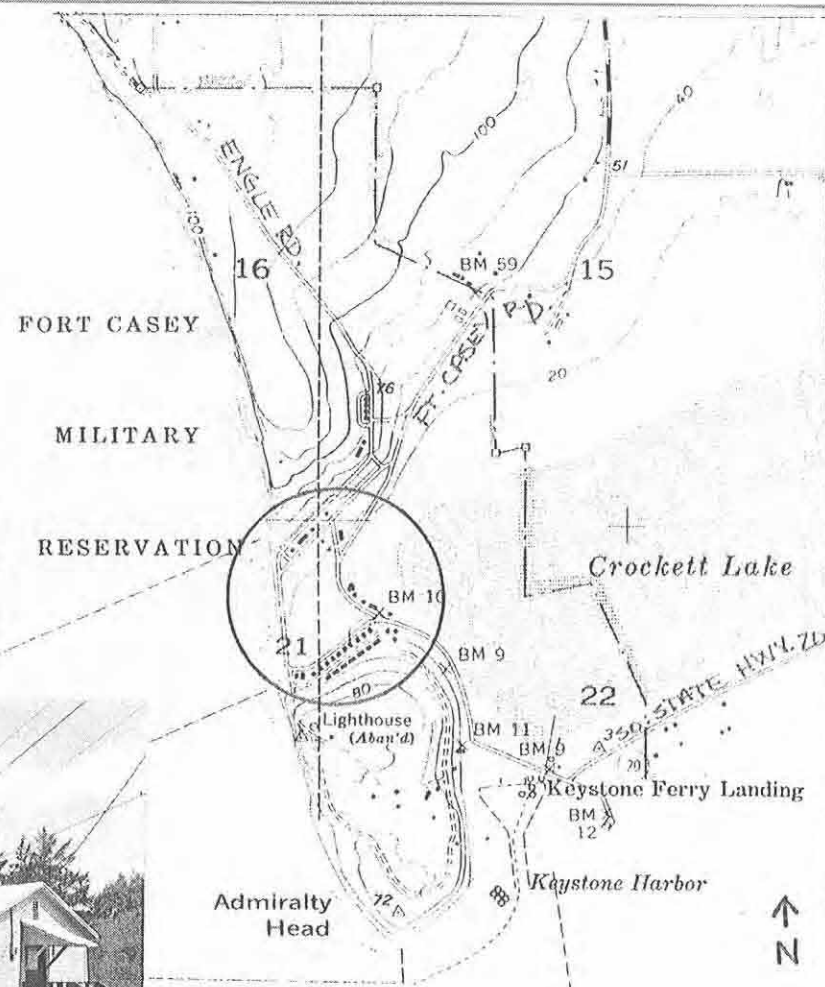
