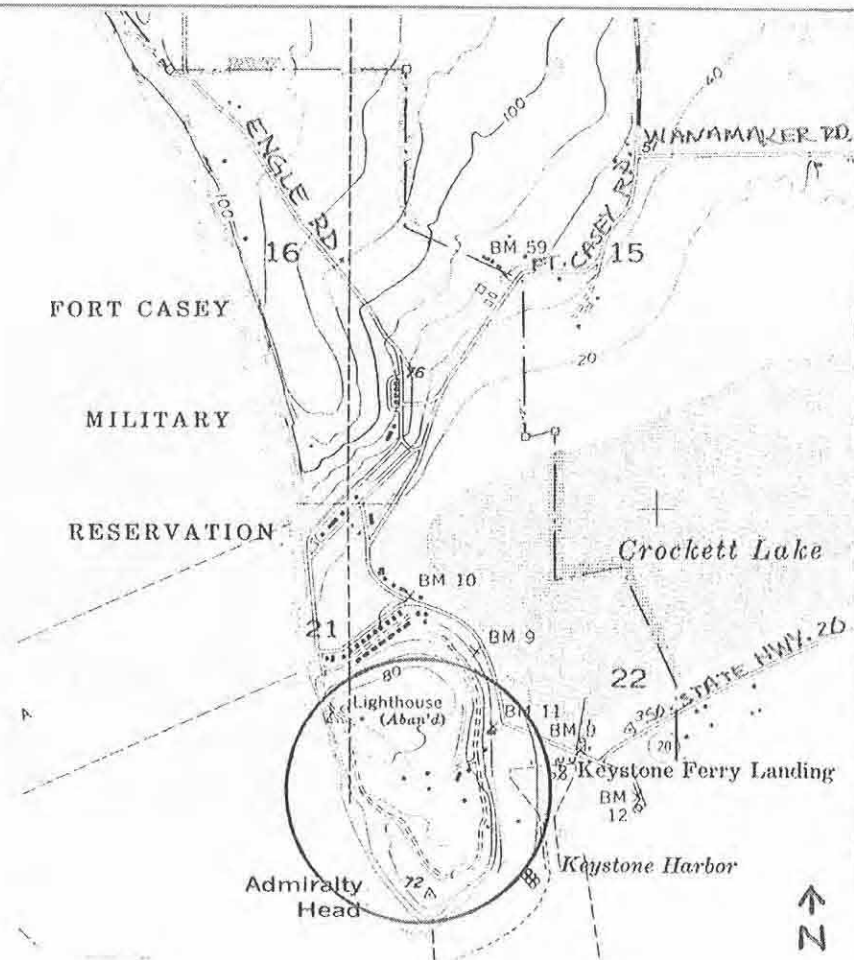
PHOTOGRAPHS AND SKETCH MAP OF LOCATION
