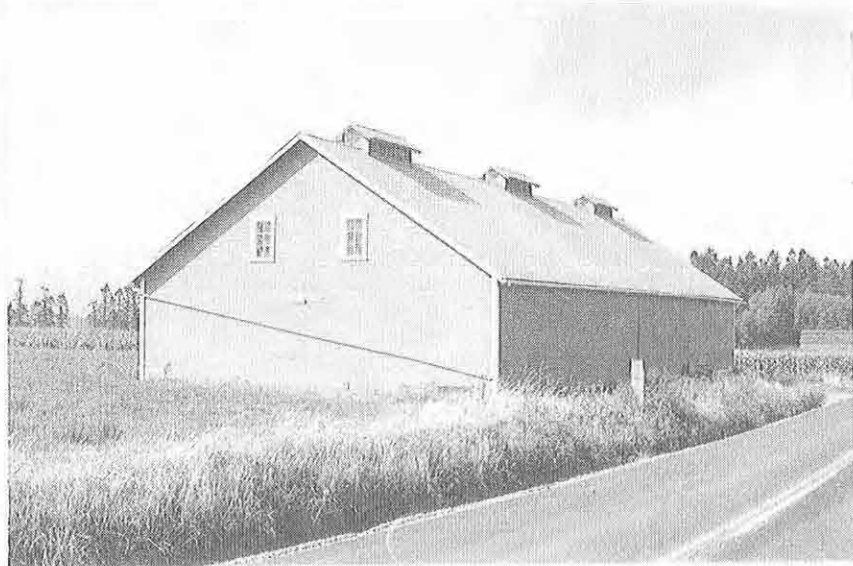

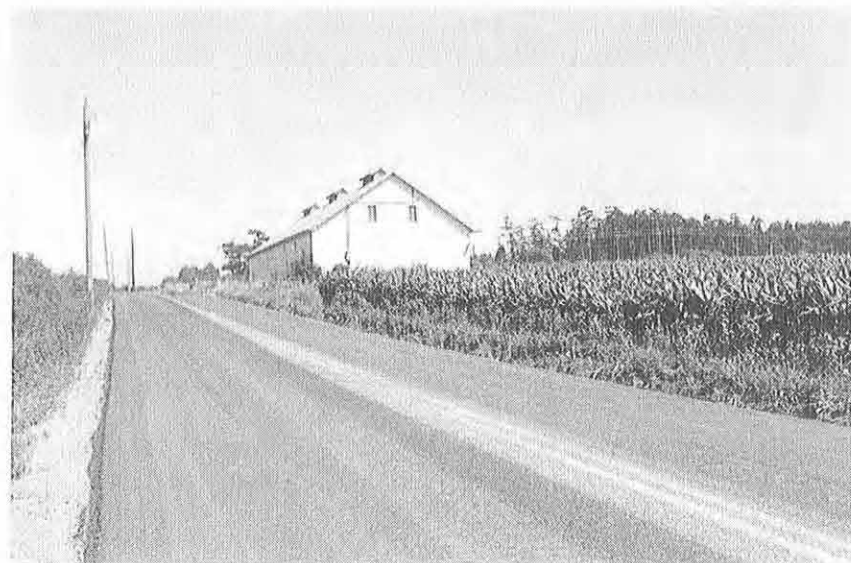
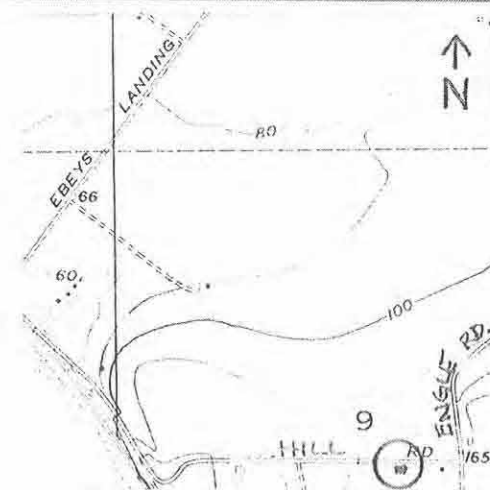

DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND HISTORY INCLUDING CONSTRUCTION DATE(S), PHYSICAL DIMENSIONS, MATERIALS, MAJOR ALTERATIONS, IMPORTANT BUILDERS, ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, ETC. Vernacular Barn. Wood frame set on concrete foundation; rectangle (40' x 108'); 1 1/2-stories; clapboard siding; galvanized metal-covered gable roof with slightly extended eaves; entrance on north facade. Exterior features include 6-pane fixed sash with plain surrounds; 3 gable-roofed cupolas/vents along ridgeline; exposed rafter ends. This barn was built for Wilbur Sherman c.1936-37 to store squash from his farm. Originally 40' x 60', its length was increased by 48'.
