

Vernacular Farmhouse with Italiante elements. Wood frame set on wood block foundation; T-shape (42'x40') with multiple additions; 7 bays wide; 1½-stories; shiplap and asbestos siding on various facades; asphalt-shingled gable roof with cross gable on south facade; off-center entrance on east facade with glass and wood-panelled door; 3 corbelled interior chimneys. Exterior features include 1/1 double-hung sash with moulded cornice; 2/2, 6/6 double-hung sash; 2 and 3-pane fixed sash; gable roofed porch on east facade supported by slightly battered posts with shiplap-sided rail; slightly projecting bay with 2/2 fixed sash enclosing porch on south facade with pilasters, moulded cornice caps, recessed wood panels and decorative brackets; moulded cornice; corner boards; plain frieze board. Notable landscape features include stone well; large holly tree; 1 wood frame hip-roofed barn with cupola; 3 wood frame gable-roofed outbuildings; Crockett Blockhouse (1855) north of complex, horizontal log frame.  MAG: One contributing building; five contributing structures.  The Col. Walter Crockett House was built c. 1860 on a Donation Claim of 322 acres filed by Crockett on March 6, 1866. He came to the land west of Crockett Lake in December of 1851. Walter Crockett, Jr. eventually inherited his father's property on the condition that he stay and care for his parents in their old age. Walter Jr. was a County Commissioner, member of the Territorial Legislature and member of the State Legislature. The house later came into the ownership of the Fred Armstrong Family who held the property until Mrs. Armstrong's death c. 1970. The property is now owned by Ed Scholz
