DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND HISTORY INCLUDING CONSTRUCTION DATE(S), PHYSICAL DIMENSIONS, MATERIALS, MAJOR ALTERATIONS, IMPORTANT BUILDERS, ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, ETC.

Military Storage Buildings. West building: wood frame set on concrete foundation; rectangle (45' x 20'); 1-story; shiplap siding; wood-shingled gable roof with slightly extended eaves; sliding wooden doors on east facade; 2 interior metal vents along ridge line. Exterior features include 6-pane fixed sash with molded sills; exposed rafter ends; molded fascia boards; corner boards; vertical wood panel skirting. East building: wood frame; rectangle (54' x 24'); 1-story; shiplap siding; wood-shingled gable roof with slightly extended eaves; multiple sliding entrance doors on west facade; 3 interior metal vents along ridge line. Exterior features include molded sills under boarded up windows; exposed rafter ends; molded frieze board; corner boards. North building: metal set on concrete foundation; rectangle (52' x 45'); 1-story; galvanized metal siding; galvanized metal-covered gable roof; entrance on west facade; 3 metal vents along ridge line. Exterior features include 9-pane fixed metal sash. Notable landscape features include small, rectangular, wood frame, gable-roofed shed north of north building.

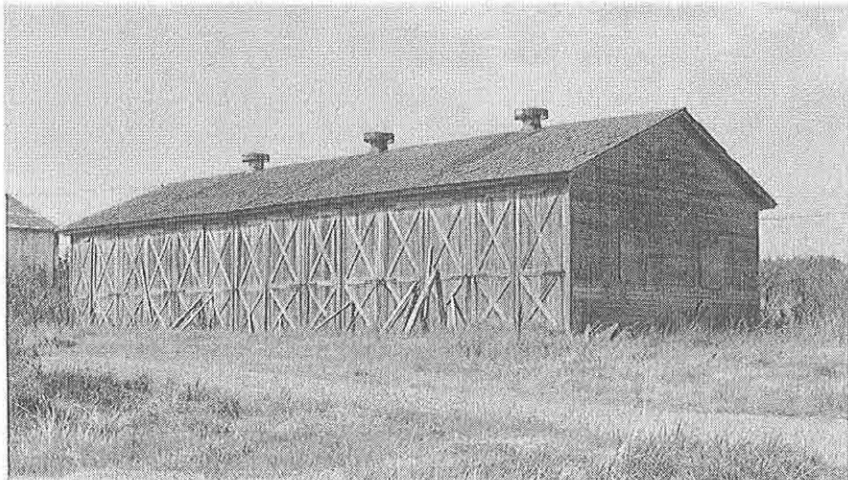
These structures date pre-World War I and were constructed for the Fort Casey Military Reservation. Originally used for warehouse/storage purposes (west building), storage of cars (east building), and possible storage of small tanks (north building). These buildings are rented by local farmer Edwin Sherman who uses them for hay and squash storage.

1995: Multi-pane windows added to south facade of west bldg; 3 contributing structures.

SIGNIFICANCE This property is significant under National Register criterion A, for its association with the United States military operations in the Reserve, and represents a period of community development, 1871-1910, followed by a period of economic stability, 1911-1945, during which the military played a key role. It retains integrity of location, setting, materials, design, workmanship, feeling and association.
