Military Wharf Building and Dock. Wood frame; rectangle (12' x 20'); 1-story; shiplap siding; uncovered gable roof. Exterior features include window openings with simple trabeated lintels and plain surrounds; extended rafter ends; corner boards. Notable landscape features include a deteriorated wooden truss bridge supported by concrete piers.

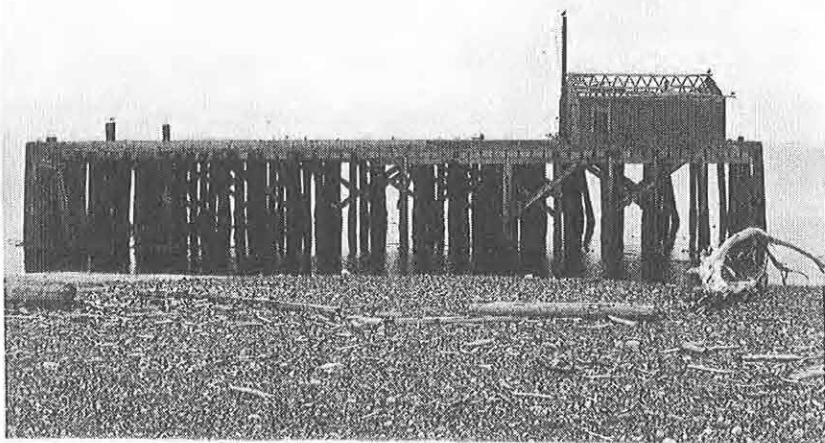
This wharf was one of the first structures erected by the military in preparation for Fort Casey. The dock originally had two storage buildings on it. All supplies needed for the construction and operation of the Fort, including food, arrived at this wharf. Small rail cars travelled to and from the wharf and over the bridge (which was originally connected up until c. 1950's), supplying the complex. Eventually roads were developed and trucks became the primary means of transporting items. A fire in 1975 destroyed a larger wharf building.

1995: Wooden truss bridge remnants removed; one contributing structure.

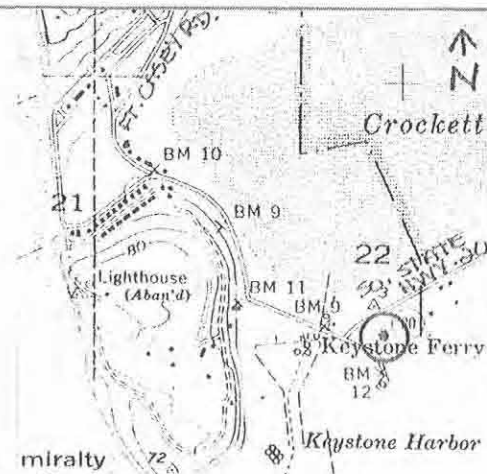

SIGNIFICANCE This property is significant under National Register criterion A, for its association with the United States military operations in the Reserve, and represents a period of community development, 1871-1910, followed by a period of economic stability, 1911-1945, during which the military played a key role. It retains integrity of location, setting, materials, design, workmanship, feeling and association.

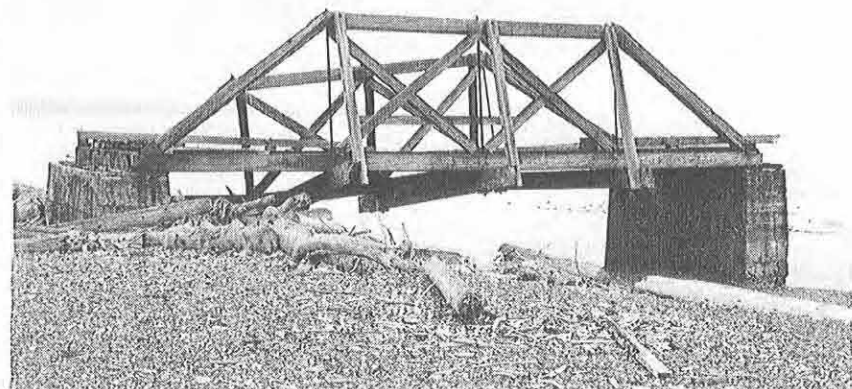
PHOTOGRAPHS AND SKETCH MAP OF LOCATION



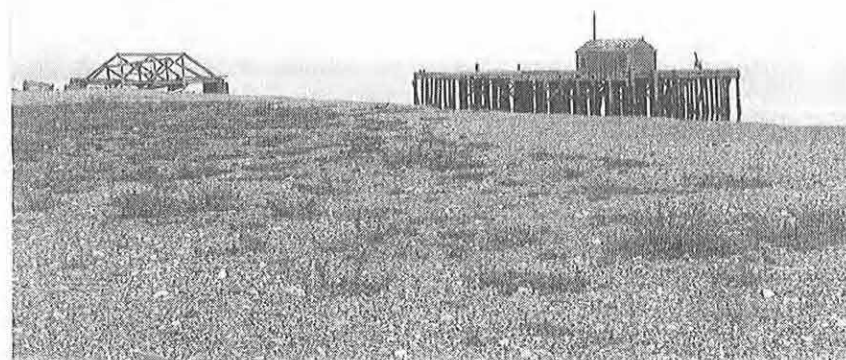
