- 13: A
- 14: If S is not immediately above O, the only character that can come between them is V. So R could be immediately above V, so B is correct.
- 15: Specific/character list question. You waste your time testing “Fifth” and “Sixth”. Start testing “Fourth.” It doesn’t work, so any answer choice with “Fourth” is wrong. E is correct.

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- 16: The sufficient condition in the question requires this setup:

6 S

5 O

4 M

3 L

2 V/R

1 R/V

So only B can be true.

17. In the possibility above, we can see V can be 1 and R can be 2, so B is correct. Let the work you've done already help you with later questions, especially questions near or at the end of the game. Never erase your valid hypotheticals!
