


#### TERMS OF SALE

This sale will be a combination mail bid and floor auction sale. Written bids must be postmarked by June 12, or after that date, mailed to us at the Rivermont Holiday Inn, Memphis, Tennessee. We will be pleased to discuss and further describe any of the notes by 'phone, but we will not be able to handle telephone bids. Even if you plan on attending the sale, we would encourage you to bid by mail, also. You would then be covered in case you are unable to attend. Please bring your catalog along with you to the convention. We wish not to run out.

- 1. Bids will be opened on the floor at the second highest mail bid and proceed from there.
- All lots are guaranteed genuine and as described. Please be sure you are bidding the correct amount on the proper lot.
- All successful bidders must remit payment immediately upon receipt of the invoice. The cost of postage and insurance will be added to the invoices of successful mail bidders.
- 4. People wishing to participate in this auction who are not planning to attend the floor auction in Memphis, must submit a signed, written mail bid, which reaches us by the closing day of the sale. If you find yourself short on time, a mailagram is acceptable.
- 5. All photographs are of the actual lots being sold.
- Prices or estimates given reflect the opinion of the cataloger as to what the lots should bring. Higher rather than lower valuations are expected to prevail.
- 7. Alternate bids are acceptable.
- 8. GRADING--The standard grades are used as outlined below. An overall grade is given to take into consideration the note's appearance. A grade of F/VG means that the reverse of a note is not as nice as the face of the note. A grade of VG-F is a grade for the complete note. Such defects as margin tears, pin holes, stains, abrasions, or other appearance are not mentioned in grades of Fine and below, unless, in the cataloger's opinion, it affects the value of the note enough to make mentioning necessary.
- 9. No return of notes is acceptable by floor bidders. If you receive a note by mail that you feel you should return for any reason, you may do so, if within 3 days of receipt and you state your reason for dissatisfaction. If it is a grading problem, please tell us. We are firm believers in 'Satisfaction Guaranteed', and we intend that you be satisfied. If we make an error, we want to know about it.
- 10. We reserve the right to reject any bid of 60% of estimate or less, or any bid of less than 15% over face.
- 11. Lots will be available for viewing in Memphis, Tennessee on June 18 and 19 at the Rivermont Holiday Inn. Lots purchased by floor bidders cannot be returned, therefore they must be viewed before bidding. ## INTRODUCTION

Welcome to our seventeenth and largest sale ever. This is the fourth International Paper Money Covention Auction Sale. ## CONTINENTAL CURRENCY

Eleven issues by the United Colonies comprise the notes that produced the saying "Not Worth a Continental". For the first year and a half after issue it was accepted at par and accounted for most of the money in circulation in our country. It ended with continental currency being exchangeable from 1790-1798 into U.S. Treas. Bonds for 1% of its face value. This was the money that paid for Revolution and freedom from England. The Early Paper Money of America by Newman was the reference used as a guide in cataloguing these early notes. The notes represented for sale here are above average condition overall, and it should be noted that our estimates are conservative as well as the grading.

## STATE SEALS

The first lot in each state, except Delaware, District of Columbia, Hawaii, New Hampshire, North Dakota, and Oklahoma, will be a printed form 8½ inches wide and 4¾ inches high, as illustrated in the Alaska listing. They have an embossed official state seal, usually on a gold foil wafer. These seals were collected in the 1880's by Gov. William Larrabee of Iowa (1886-1890). They are similar to a collection assembled by General F.E. Spinner's daughter and later owned by Dr. Limpert. We will list these great items without estimates. We can say, however, that they are of equal rarity to the other items in this catalog and offer a great opportunity for specialists to acquire a centerpiece for their collection.

Great seal on spiked gold foil. Autographed: C. Meyer Gulick, governor (1886-1888); W. Bauta, private secretary; Jas A. Bayard, sec'y of state. This seal never used on national bank notes.

  An unaccountably rare note in small size, this being only the second note reported. Nogales is on the border adjacent to Nogales, Mexico.
  There is a 1" tear at top center. Worth a bid of \$300 or more.
- \$5 1902 The Consolidated National Bank of Tucson 4287 VG Ex-James Wade. Sigs are weak. Arizona remains a major rarity among the states. Est: \$250 +

#### **WAR OF 1812 TREASURY NOTES**

Act of February 24, 1815

The Charter of the Bank of the United States had not been renewed in 1811, and Congress had not burdened the citizens with internal taxes, so the War of 1812 needed to be financed with loans (bonds). Because of a lack of cooperation by eastern banks, land sales were terrible.

Therefore, in June, 1812, Congress authorized the issue of \$5,000,000 worth of 5.4% Treasury Notes in \$100 and \$1000 denominations. These high value notes did not circulate much, except between banks. A similar Act was passed in February, 1813. Two more Acts, with slight differences, were then passed in March, 1813, and December, 1814, mainly to redeem the older notes. (The march, 1813, Act did add a \$20 note to the series, and the 1814 Act provided for an additional \$3,000,000 to make up for the slack in bond sales.)

By the end of 1814, war debts were overwhelming. On February 24, 1815, Congress passed the fifth (and final) Act of this series, which called for a huge issue of \$25,000,000 in Treasury Notes to finish paying for the war. Notes of \$3, \$5, \$10, \$20, \$50 and \$100 denominations were issued. Obviously, the small denominations were intended to finally "let the public in".

Nearly all the War of 1812 Treasury Notes were actually redeemed and then, naturally, destroyed. Consequently, these notes are very rare. Most of the remaining notes are unissued, proof (or specimen) notes, which were distributed to customs officials, banks, etc., for use in detecting counterfeits.

This \$10 note is thus an example of the first \$10 note issued by the U.S. government — 46 years before the Demand Notes of 1861.




