INTRODUCTION

Welcome to our eighteenth mail auction. This time we are offering a super selection of notes from almost all areas of National Bank note collecting.

North Carolina and Wisconsin, particularly, are well represented. Collectors of \$50's and \$100's, including type II 1929's, will find a large selection in this offering. Interesting and fancy names are scattered throughout the catalog.

As many of you already know, our book, **The Standard Catalog of National Bank Notes**, retail \$75.00, will be available in November. The pre-publication offer of \$60.00 from the publisher, Krause Publications, expires October 25th. To our clients we are extending the same pre-publication price of \$60 for orders received this year. Be sure to check the flyer in your catalog for our special offer.

For this super selection of notes we have cut back on the usual attribution and are including rarity numbers for every state and bank title. These rarities are based on over 100,000 documented notes. What this means is, each rarity assigned is based on the number of notes recorded for that particular bank title:

no notes, one, or two notes	Rarity 6
three to five notes	Rarity 5
six to eleven notes	Rarity 4
twelve to twenty-four notes	Rarity 3
twenty-five to fifty notes	Rarity 2
fifty and over notes	Rarity 1

An asterisk after the rarity number (example, 5*), indicates that one or more uncut sheets are counted. The rarities for each state in large and small follow the introduction.

The rarity works the same for both large and small. You will find two groupings of the states for large and small state rarities. The 100,000+ notes documented broke down almost exactly half and half, in other words, 50,000 large and 50,000 small. We have not seen all the notes there are. All the boxes haven't been opened yet. Notes continue to surface, so many of our rarities will change. It does mean that the number indicated is that bank title's share of the notes recorded. We think it is the best road map yet available. We wish to thank again all those who shared their information and knowledge with us, and through us, the hobby. We wish also to apologize to those whose name was inadvertently left out of the over 300 acknowledgements in our book.

In order to meet the publisher's deadline, we worked right up to the wire and a few things did not get done. The co-operation we received from Krause Publications was unbelievable. Their computer department worked into the night for the entire week we were there finishing up, and their staff was always at our disposal. We hope you will like it.

We wish also to thank all who helped make our Memphis auction such a great success. You are sure to find notes of interest in the 919 lots that follow. Remember, regardless of rarity or estimates, it is you, the collector, who will determine the price by your bids.

TERMS OF SALE

To give all bidders an equal opportunity, bids will not be opened until the closing date of the sale. In other words, we will not know ourselves, and therefore cannot reveal, where the high bid is until the sale is over. To help us segregate bids from our regular mail, we are providing envelopes for use only for the mail bid sale. Please mark any other envelope you may use on the outside so we can know it is a bid. Skeptics are invited to inspect the unopened bids up to the closing date.

Bids must be received by us on or before November 30, so to insure your efforts are not wasted, mail the bid early. We will be pleased to discuss and further describe any of the notes by phone, but we must insist that telephone bids be confirmed in writing before the deadline. Bids will be opened November 30, 1982.

1. Each lot will be sold to the highest bidder unreserved at a slight advance over the next highest bid. In the event of identical mail bids, the earliest postmarked will receive the lot.
2. As in all legitimate auctions, the second highest bidder will set the price. Up to the \$1000 level, advances will be 10% with \$50.00 maximum. At \$1000 and over, advances will be 5%. This method will permit a bidder to make a liberal bid with the assurance that his bid will be reduced to the indicated amount above the next highest bid. In cases where only one bid is received, the estimate will be used as the underbid.
3. All lots are guaranteed genuine and as described. Please be sure you are bidding the correct amount on the proper lot. Only signed, written bids are acceptable.
4. All successful bidders must remit payment immediately upon receipt of the invoice and/or lots. The cost of postage and insurance will be added to the invoices of successful mail bidders. Lots delivered in Iowa are subject to State Sales Tax of 3% unless a resale number is given. Terms are available; see your bid sheet.
5. All photographs are of the actual lots being sold.
6. Prices or estimates given reflect the opinion of the cataloger as to what the lots should bring. Higher rather than lower valuations are expected to prevail.
7. Alternate bids are acceptable.
8. GRADING—The standard grades are used as outlined below. An overall grade is given to take into consideration the note's appearance. A grade of F/VG means that the reverse of a note is not as nice as the face of the note. A grade of VG-F is a grade for the complete note. Such defects as margin tears, pin holes, stains, abrasions, or other appearance are not mentioned in grades of Fine or below, unless, in the cataloger's opinion, it affects the value of the note enough to make mentioning necessary.
9. If you receive a note by mail that you feel you should return for any reason, you may do so, if within 3 days of receipt and you state your reason for dissatisfaction. If it is a grading problem, please tell us. We are firm believers in 'Satisfaction Guaranteed', and we intend that you be satisfied. If we make an error, we want to know about it.
10. We reserve the right to reject any bid of 60% of estimate or less, or any bid of less than 15% over face.

The Hickman-Oakes 18th Auction was comprised of 919 lots, of which all but 245 were national bank notes. The Carolina notes were featured. Lot 552, the \$10 Charleston note of original series with charter number, in AU condition, was a fresh, crisp note with little handling. This original series \$10 issued by the bank, receiving charter 1662 at the close of the Civil War in 1865, is unique for the whole state. This \$10 note brought \$4200 against an estimate of \$5000.

Fifty-one North Carolina notes were offered as the first half of a large collection of this state's notes, with the second half being offered in the 19th sale in March of 1983. There was a good selection for the type buyer as well as the serious location collector of North Carolina. Lot 375, a \$5 original series with plate date of 1871, in XF, brought \$1650 against an estimate of \$2500.

The high grade type notes were bid fairly strongly, with a lot of bidding coming on XF and AU notes rather than, as a year and a half ago, when all bids were on CU notes. All the miscellaneous lots were well supported.

Consignments are now being taken for the 19th sale and we need your notes soon, probably by January 10th, if you wish them to be used in this March, 1983 auction.
