

TERMS OF SALE

To give all bidders an equal opportunity, bids will not be opened until the closing date of the sale. In other words, we will not know ourselves, and therefore cannot reveal, where the high bid is until the sale is over. To help us segregate bids from our regular mail, we are providing envelopes for use only for the mail bid sale. Please mark any other envelope you may use on the outside so we can know it is a bid. Skeptics are invited to inspect the unopened bids up to the closing date.

To insure your efforts are not wasted, mail this bid early. We will be pleased to discuss and further describe any of the notes by phone, but we must insist that telephone bids be confirmed in writing before the deadline. Bids will be opened May 25, 1984.

- Each lot will be sold to the highest bidder unreserved at a slight advance over the next highest bid. In the event of identical mail bids, the earliest postmarked will receive the lot.
- 2. As in all legitimate auctions, the second highest bidder will set the price. Up to the \$1000 level, advances will be 10% with \$50.00 maximum. At \$1000 and over, advances will be 5%. This method will permit a bidder to make a liberal bid with the assurance that his bid will be reduced to the indicated amount above the next highest bid. In cases where only one bid is received, the estimate will be used as the underbid.
- All lots are guaranteed genuine and as described. Please be sure you are bidding the correct amount on the proper lot. Only signed, written bids are acceptable.
- 4. All successful bidders must remit payment immediately upon receipt of the invoice and/or lots. The cost of postage and insurance will be added to the invoices of successful mail bidders. Lots delivered in lowa are subject to State Sales Tax of 4% unless a resale number is given. Terms are available; see your bid sheet.
- 5. All photographs are of the actual lots being sold.
- Prices or estimates given reflect the opinion of the cataloger as to what the lots should bring. Higher rather than lower valuations are expected to prevail.
- 7. Alternate bids are acceptable. No buy bids are acceptable.
- 8. GRADING—The standard grades are used as outlined below. An overall grade is given to take into consideration the note's appearance. A grade of F/VG means that the reverse of a note is not as nice as the face of the note. A grade of VG-F is a grade for the complete note. Such defects as margin tears, pin holes, stains, abrasions, or other appearance are not mentioned in grades of Fine or below, unless, in the cataloger's opinion, it affects the value of the note enough to make mentioning necessary.
- 9. If you receive a note by mail that you feel you should return for any reason, you may do so, if within 3 days of receipt and you state your reason for dissatisfaction. If it is a grading problem, please tell us. We are firm believers in 'Satisfaction Guaranteed', and we intend that you be satisfied. If we make an error, we want to know about it.
- 10. We reserve the right to reject any bid of 60% of estimate or less, or any bid of less than 15% over face.



Should exceed \$600.

\$50**-* 1902RS First National Bank of Lacon M-347 CU Rarity 6. This note has been one of the major rarities from the entire state of Illinois, and even the entire field of national bank notes. It might be interesting to consider how rare this note is in relation to the notes issued. Albert Grinnell had his pick of the available notes for many years and he owned eight specimens, including this one (lot 1323). Three of the notes were described as uncirculated, again, including this note. Over the last 18 years we have recorded 42 notes, four of which have never been exposed numismatically. Our census breaks down as follows:

One \$50 Red Seal recorded for every 9,808 notes issued. None at all were issued in the states of Alabama, Alaska, Arizona, District of Columbia, Hawaii, New Mexico, South Carolina, Utah and Wyoming. Only the \$500's and \$1000's, the 1882 Date back \$100's, the \$50 and \$100 1882 Value Back, and the 1902 plain back \$100 were issued in smaller quantities among the large size notes.

In the state of Illinois we have recorded six Red Seal \$100's from the Continental National Bank of Chicago, but only one \$50, although the same number of each was issued. We hope there are other specimens that remain in hiding and we hope to hear of them as they surface. Meantime, this great note is available in supurb condition, beautifully signed by W.H. Ford and J.F. Thompson, with Albert Grinnell pedigree, and from a rare bank to the highest bidder, with the price set by the second highest bidder. We anticipate the realization will be in the

\$5000 range at least.

\$5 1875 First National Bank of Lincoln 2126 U Rarity 2. Another note always popular with collectors. This is a particularly tough type and denomination to obtain in top grade.

- 92 \$20** 1902 First Nat'l Bank of Mayfield 2245 VG Rarity 3. We count 15 pieces of these. Tape on reverse. Much better than the \$10. Est: \$50
- 93 \$10 1902 Nat'l Deposit Bank of Owensboro S-4006 G Rarity 3 with thirteen notes recorded. Tattered borders and heavy folds. Est: \$50
