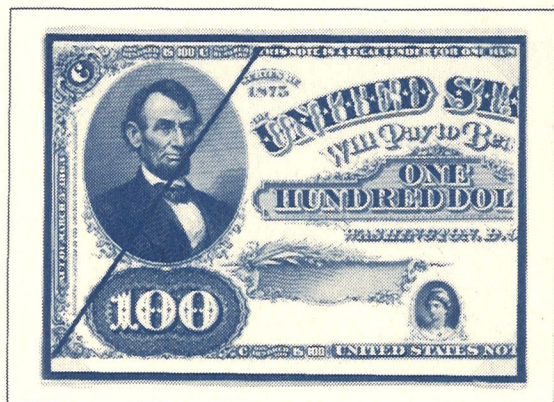
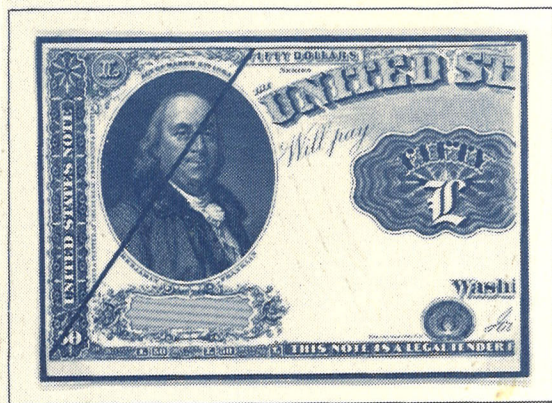

# Hickman Oakes 35th Floor & Mail Bid Auction June 24 & 25, 1988





## INTRODUCTION

Welcome to the Hickman - Oakes 35th sale. We are honored for the fifth time by the Memphis Coin Club in being given the privilege of conducting the auction for the International Paper Money Convention. We believe this sale will be a worthy successor to the first, the fourth, the seventh, and the ninth sale we conducted for the convention. We are proud of the quality of the material, the confidence placed in us by our consignors, and the manner in which our sales have been conducted in our other four sales, and with your help we hope to add one more outstanding sale to the record.

From Alabama with a half dozen of the rarest notes known to have survived from that state, to Wyoming with two previously unrecorded notes and a very rare town, the nationals in this sale offer many outstanding opportunities for the astute collector to enhance his collection.

Worthy of special mention is a worn but desirable and rare Gold Bank note from Santa Barbara, an excellent Illinois section including several Decatur notes and other Decaturs from Indiana, Michigan, Alabama, ect. A Particularly interesting note from Richmond, Indiana, a much better than usual selection from Maine, Massachusetts, Michigan, Nebraska & New Hampshire. A couple of rare Kansas City notes, a serial number five, Type Two Twenty from McGill, Nevada as well as several other number five notes from the collection of Amon Carter.

From North Carolina a classic rarity; a first charter hundred from Raleigh. Several better Pittsburgh notes, more Vermont notes than usual, and last but by no means least, an excellent Wisconsin selection, most of which are pen signed and in better state of preservation. Another classic rarity, a first charter fifty from Beloit will be found in the Wisconsin as well as three very interesting Chippewa Falls notes.

Large size type notes are well represented from Fr. 1 to Fr. 1215, with many scarce, high grade notes, and featuring a nice group of low serial numbered \$1 eagle notes, and several scarce stars. Error collectors will find our best offering ever, over 70 lots, and we have significant listings of small size currency, stock certificates, Philippine bank notes, with most other areas of paper collecting being represented also.

A macerated currency bust of Benjamin Harrison, a rarely available post card made of macerated currency and a selection of bank post cards adds up to "something for everybody."

**Terms of Sale**

This sale will be a combination mail bid and floor auction sale. Late bids should be sent to us at the Crown Plaza, 250 North Main Street, Memphis, TN 38103 and marked "Hold for arrival June 23rd".

We will be pleased to discuss and further describe any of the notes by telephone. If you plan on attending the sale, we would encourage you to bid by mail, also. You would then be covered in case you are unable to attend. Please bring your catalog along with you to the convention.

1. The Bid will be opened on the floor at the second highest mail bid and proceed from there.

2. All lots are guaranteed genuine and as described. Please be sure you are bidding the correct amount on the proper lot.

3. All successful bidders must remit payment immediately upon receipt of the invoice. The cost of postage and insurance will be added to the invoices of the successful bidders plus 5% buyer's fee.

4. People wishing to participate in this auction who are not planning to attend the floor auction in Memphis, Must submit a signed, written mail bid, which reaches us by the closing day of the sale. If you find yourself short on time, a mailgram is acceptable. Telephone bids will be accepted, but must be backed up with a written mail bid sent the same day the telephone bid is made.

5. All photographs are of the actual lots being sold.

6. Prices or estimates given reflect the opinion of the cataloger as to what the lots are worth. Higher than lower valuations are expected to prevail.

7. Alternate bids are acceptable, but only between two lots and they must be lots that follow each other in number. We cannot handle an alternate bid among several different lots, nor will we attempt to handle either/or bid(s) between more than two lots.



8. **GRADING-** The standard grades are used as outlined. An overall grade is given to take into consideration the note's appearance. A grade of F/VG means that the reverse of the note is not as nice as the face of the note. A grade of VG-F is a grade for the complete note. Such defects as margin tears, pin holes, stains, abrasions, or other appearance are not mentioned in grades of Fine & below, unless, in the cataloger's opinion, it affects the value of the note enough to make mentioning necessary.

9. **No return of notes is acceptable by floor bidders.** If you receive a note by mail that you feel you should return for any reason, you may do so, if within 3 days of receipt and you state your reason for dissatisfaction. If it is a grading problem, please tell us. We are firm believers in "Satisfaction Guaranteed", and we intend that you be satisfied. If we make an error, we want to know about it.

10. We reserve the right to reject any bid of 60% of estimate or less, or any bid of less than 15% over face.

11. Lots will be available for viewing at the Cook Convention Center in Memphis during show hours. Lots purchased by floor bidders cannot be returned, therefore they must be viewed before bidding. Lots will be available for viewing in Iowa City, Iowa, by contacting Dean Oakes, (319)338-1144.

Most are very ornate, printed from litho stones. Most would retail \$2 - \$5 each. You buy the lot Est: \$75
- 2 Lot of 44 checks mostly national bank issues including a Helena, Montana with a depiction of Old Faithful in the vignette, also a Casselton, Dakota territorial of 1884. Most very ornate, 5 Unissued, all different. Good lot. Est: \$75
- 3 Lot of 38 different checks, state banks and national banks, an attractive ornate group. One Montana check is priced at \$15, several others \$4 - \$5 each. Couple of territorials, nice lot. Well worth \$75.
- 4 Small lot of Fort Madison, Iowa checks - Two Banking House of Johnstone & Bacon. Two Bank of Fort Madison, one with Revenue stamp other has 2¢ stamp printed in. - 14 British Honduras Government 6% Debenture, Oct. 1, 1920, \$100 Very ornate brown printing - 4 pgs. (14 X 22" pgs.). Unissued complete with all coupons attached. Few scattered holes do not detract from over all appearance.

Checks we see alot of but not so many cancelled notes. These three lots of notes are all from the famous B. Max Mehl of Fort Worth, TX and are from 1920-24.

- 15 30+ different notes all payable to the Fort Worth National Bank. All with an ink paid stamp & B Max Mehl's signature. Most for 90 days at 10%. Bid as you like. Est: \$50+

- 16 Another lot of paid notes signed by B. Max Mehl to the Texas State Bank and a few later ones to the Texas National Bank. 30+ pcs. Est: \$50+

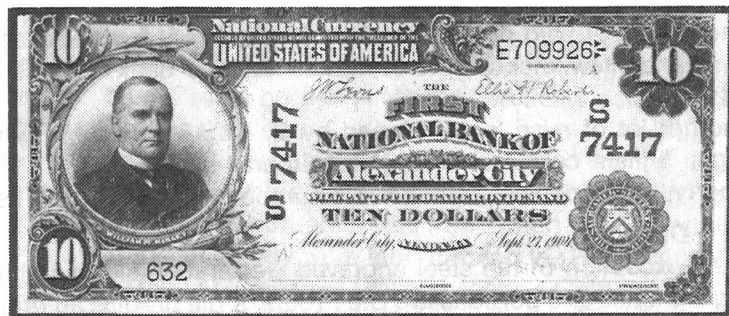

Rarity 4. Issued only in the five dollar denomination. Type II fives are always popular. Est: \$75+

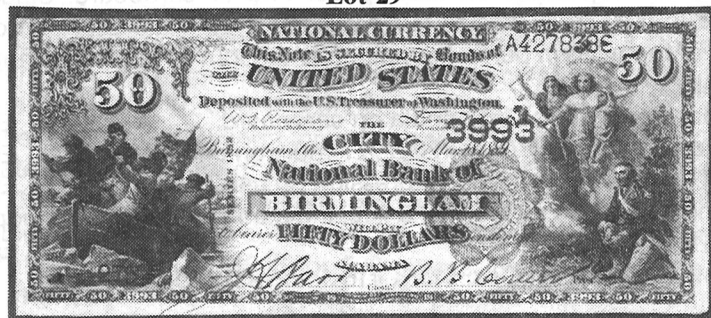

Rarity 6. This is the only large size note we know of from Tallapoosa County in East Alabama. A very attractive and rare type and in a remarkable state of preservation. Cut close at top and slightly into the design at left. We believe this note is Alabama's most desirable red seal and that it will greatly exceed \$1000 and possibly \$1500
- 30 \$5\*\* 1929, The Anniston NB 4250 VG  
Rarity 4. Well but evenly circulated. Est: \$50
- 31 \$10 1902, American - Traders NB of Birmingham 7020 AVF  
Rarity 2. A note with much remaining crispness and eye appeal. Bold engraved sigs of A.J. Daly & J.C. Parsons Jr. Est: \$75



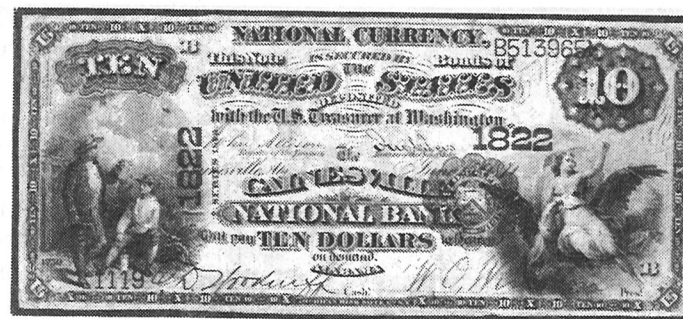

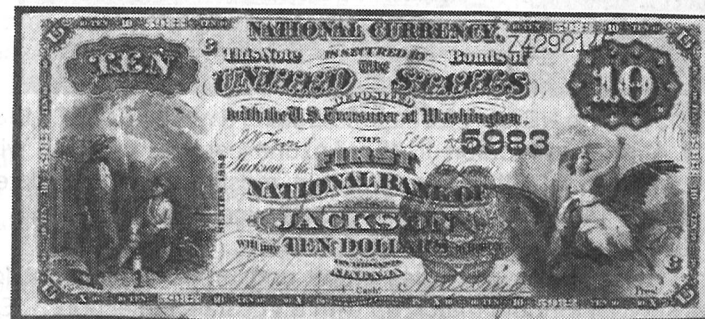

- 32 \$50 1882BB, The City NB of Birmingham 3993 VF  
Rarity 6. We believe this is the only known fifty dollar brown back from the entire state of Alabama. It is also a unique note for this bank, closed since 1895 and with only \$850 in fifties and hundreds outstanding in 1910. Brown pen sigs of J.H. Barr and B.B. Comer. Braxton Bragg Comer was a governor of Alabama. This note is worth whatever it costs and is likely to realized in the range of \$2550
- 33 \$5 1902 The National Bank of Boaz 11870 VG-F  
Rarity 6. From one of Alabama's most elusive towns, best known today for its concentration of manufacturers outlet stores. Vivid red signatures of D.K. Searey and Hogan Jackson. Only denomination issued and we know of no others. This note is likely to approach \$550.
- 34 \$10 The City NB of Decatur 10336 VG-F  
Rarity 4. Purple signatures of W.B. Shackelford and C.C. Harris. Last type of third charter note with duplicate serial numbers and without geographical letters. Well worth a bid of; \$100+
- 35 \$10 1929 First NB in Decatur 10336 VG-F  
Rarity 3\*. With the new title adopted Sept. 26, 1930. We count three uncut sheets and three single notes in our census. Unless and until a sheet is cut, a better Alabama note. This nice specimen likely to realize \$100 or more.
- 36 \$5 1882DTS, The Dothan NB S5909 VG  
Rarity 3. Most of the known specimen of the very scarce type are from Dothan. Should exceed, \$100



- 37 \$10\* 1875, The Gainesville NB 1822 F  
Rarity 6. A note of exceptional merit. This is the only 1875 Series ten known to us from Alabama, and additionally it is the only note from Sumter County we know of. Gainesville was a thriving cotton port on the Tombigee River in West Alabama. Population now is only 214. Handsome brown pen sigs of C.D. Woodruff & W.O. Winston plus great rarity of type & location equals great desirability. Likely to exceed \$1000.



- 38 \$10 1882BB, The FNB of Jackson 5983 VF  
Rarity 6. Serial number one. From a state where number one notes are virtually unknown, and from a bank and town with no other notes reported as known. Sure to be an exciting and sought after note - likely to exceed \$1000.

- 39 \$1\*\* Orig., The FNB of Mobile (1595) G  
Rarity 3. Fr 380. Worn, torn and tape repaired on back but of great desirability and rarity. The FNB of Mobile was the first of only five Alabama banks to issue ones and only two other specimens are known to have survived, neither of which have been available at public sale. An opportunity as rare as the note. Worthy of liberal bid, sure to exceed \$550

## Arizona



- 40 \$20\*\* 1902, The NB of Arizona of Phoenix P-3728 VG  
Rarity 4. A new addition to the Arizona census, this one with the highest serial with this title. Well but mostly evenly circulated. An opportunity, not often available. Should exceed \$300
- 41 \$20 1929, The Consolidated NB of Tucson 4287 G-VG  
Rarity 1. The many pin holes at left end probably account for this notes survival. Should match up with a VG state collection. Est: \$50

## Arkansas

- 42 \$5\*\* 1929, The FNB of Hope 12533 VG  
Now Rarity 3. Lloyd Spencer & R.G. McRae sigs. Est: Near \$50
- 43 \$5 1929, The FNB of Lake Village 11262 VG-F  
Rarity 5. A Very scarce note from S E Arkansas near Memphis. From one of Mr. Donlon's last sales. Est: \$75 or more
- 44 \$5 1902, The FNB of Eureka 5986 VG  
Rarity 2. Well but evenly circulated notes from this bank, while not rare, are very closely held. Est: \$100 or more

## California

- 45 \$10\*\* 1902, Bank of Italy, National Trust & Savings Assn. 13044 VG-F  
Rarity 1. Original title of Bank of America. A clean copy worth about \$50.

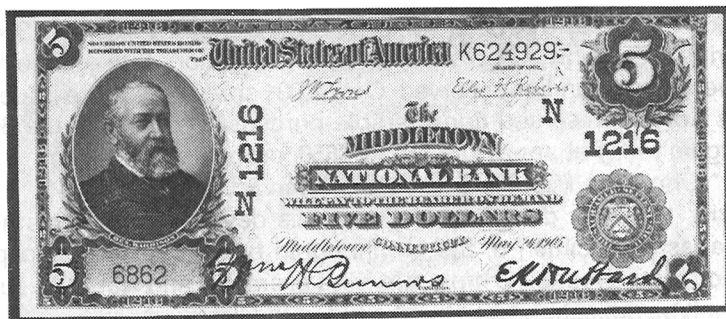
- 46 \$100\*\* 1902, Bank of Italy, National Trust & Savings Assn. 13044 F  
Rarity 1. But only three are of this denomination, this one being the lowest serial number observed. Only 9,081 specimens were issued and this note represented considerable purchasing power in the 30's. A bargain today at any figure below \$550, probably \$350 or so.
- 47 \$5\*\* Orig., The First N. Gold Bank of San Francisco (1741) VG-F  
Rarity 1. A very decent example of this desirable type. This note is ideal as a specimen of the original gold bank note. This acceptable grade is far superior to most surviving examples and would be suitable for a type collection. Worthy of a bid in the range of \$500.
- 48 \$10\*\* 1882BB, The FNB of San Francisco 1741 98%F  
Rarity 1. The lower left corner, about 1/4" is missing. Otherwise a clean and attractive note worth about \$100 or more.
- 49 \$5 1902DB, Merchants NB of San Francisco P-9882 F  
Rarity 2. Cut close at top, but with much remaining crispness. Should realize \$50 or more.
- 50 \$5 1882BB, The Wells Fargo Nevada NB of San Francisco P5105 VG-F  
Rarity 1. A very pleasing and handsome note with one of the great Western Titles. Aside from the number one note, this is the lowest serial (1457) observed. Nice enough to realize about \$150.
- 51 \$10 1929, The FNB of Santa Ana 3520 F+  
Rarity 2. No problems and sure to please. Est: \$35+

## Colorado

- 52 \$5 1902DTS, The Federal NB of Denver W-10064 VG-F  
Rarity 5. Definitely a better Denver note. From a bank that bowed out in 1915 after a little over four years operations. An honest note with good sigs and no problems one of the "Forbidden" titles and rare besides. Should realize \$200+.
- 53 \$20\*\* 1929, The FNB of Longmont 11253 VF  
Rarity 3. A tough denomination for their bank and in superior condition relative to the other survivors. Likely to realize \$200 or more.

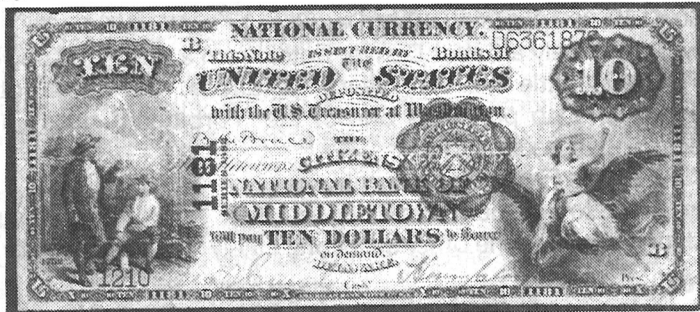

- 54 \$20\*\* 1929II, FNB of Litchfield 709 CU  
Now Rarity 4. Serial #A000002. From a five note (#2-6) Uncut sheet sold by Wm. P. Donlon in September 1972. The number one note is probably available. This beauty should be worth a bid of \$200 or so.
- 55 \$20\*\* 1929II, The FNB of Litchfield 709 CU  
Now Rarity 4. Serial #A000005. This is the first of ten serial numbers 5 notes collected by the late Amon Carter. Others will be found in Mass., Minn., Neb., Nev., N.Y., Okla., Penn. & Texas. A rare opportunity to acquire some superlative notes. Est: \$200 or so



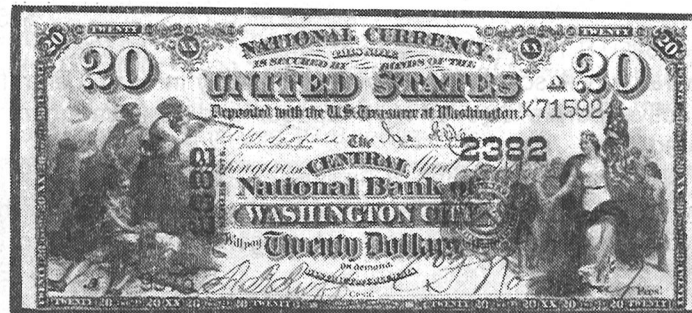
- 56 \$5 1902RS, The Middletown NB N-1216 U  
Rarity 3. A very handsome specimen, with bold black sigs and vivid color. Cut close at top right, but not into design. A showpiece worthy of a liberal bid that should exceed \$550.
- 57 \$5 1902, The Mystic River NB, Mystic 645 AVG  
Rarity 5. Ex-Donlon "Space filler". Neat engraved sigs of G.S. Richmond & H.B. Noyes. Scarce enough to realize near \$150.
- 58 \$10\*\* 1902, The FNB of New Haven N-2 XF  
Rarity 3. Start a low charter number collection with this beauty. nice enough to realize \$150+.
- 59 \$10 1929, The NB of Commerce of New London 666 F  
Now Rarity 3. A nice specimen with sigs of Earle W. Stamm & Wm. H. Reeves. Est: \$50 or more

#### Delaware



- 60 \$10 1882BB, The Citizens NB of Middletown 1181 VG  
Now Rarity 4. This is the rare vertical charter number variety, and the only such we've seen ever from Delaware. A similar note, without the vertical charter, realized \$450 in our November, 1984 sale. Brown pen sigs of Jno. S. Crouch & Henry Clayton. Should realize in the range of \$500.
- 61 \$5 1902, The New Castle County NB of Odessa 1281 VG  
Now Rarity 3. And still not enough of these to go around. Sigs. of Jos. G. Brown & Dan'l Corbit. Likely to realize about \$200.
- 62 \$20 1929, The Union NB of Wilmington 1390 F  
Now Rarity 3. Better condition and twice the face. Est: \$75

- 63 \$10 1929II, The Union NB of Wilmington 1390 VG-F  
Now Rarity 3. Popular denomination & type in an unmolested copy. Should realize \$75 or so.



#### District of Columbia

- 64 \$20 1875, The Central NB of Washington City 2382 VF+  
Rarity 3. A.B. Ruff & C. F. Normant sigs. From the Leidman collection cataloged by us in 1985. This note is still one of the best of the 6 known \$20 first charter notes known to us from the district. A Prize. Est: \$750

Rarity 4. Evenly soiled still likely to realize near \$50.

Rarity 3. Impeccable pedigree of Grinnell, Donlon, Schermerhorn, Baily, and Medlar collections. Sigs of William B. Slade and J. Rhodes Brown. Realized \$925 at the June, 1986 sale, likely to bring a price in excess of \$1000
- 67 \$10\*\* 1929, The FNB of Monticello 9346 VF  
Rarity 4\*. You can wait until the sheet is cut, or you can bid on this nice note. Should prove to be a popular lot and approach or exceed \$250.

- 68 \$10\*\* 1902, The FNB of Hawaii at Honolulu, Territory of Hawaii 5550 VG-F  
Rarity 1. A very presentable specimen from this popular location. Should realize in the range of \$200.

Rarity 3\*. Evenly soiled and circulated. H.D. Compton and D.F. Richards sigs. Est. \$100+

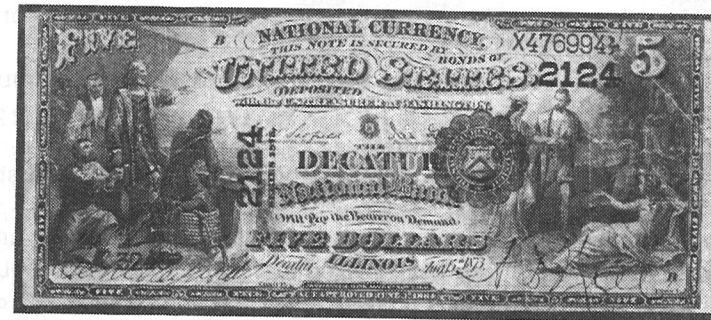
