#### TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SALE

- 1. This is a public auction and mail bid sale held by licensed auctioneers. All lots are sold to the highest bidder without reserve. There are no restrictions on who may bid in the auction, but the auctioneer reserves the right, at his sole discretion, to refuse any bid from anyone.
- 2. The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall be the buyer. In the event of any dispute between bidders, the auctioneer may, at his sole discretion, put the lot up for sale again. The auctioneer's decision shall be final and binding upon all bidders.
- 3. All bids are to be per lot as numbered in this catalog.
- 4. No lots can be broken.
- 5. All sales are are strictly for cash in United States funds, and are due and payable immediately upon receipt of the auction invoice and/or notes. Lots delivered in the state the auction is held are subject to all applicable state and local taxes, unless approriate permits are on file with us. Shipping, handling and insurance charges will be added to invoices shipped by mail. Overseas buyers must furnish their own insurance during shipment.
- 6. The auctioneer reserves the right to require full payment before delivery of the material. Bidder personally guarantees payment and if a corporation, officer or principal in the corporation agrees to personally guarantee payment. It is the responsibility of the buyer to provide adequate insurance coverage for the notes once they are in his possession. Risk of loss shall be borne by the buyer following shipment of the notes.
- 7. The auctioneer reserves the right to refuse to honor any bid which, in his opinion, is not submitted in good faith, or may not be supported by satisfactory references, as he in his sole discretion shall determine. Auctioneer may refuse any bid not commensurate with the value of the lot.
- 8. No buy or unlimited bids will be accepted. When there are mail bidders for a lot, the bid is submitted to the auctioneer acting on behalf of the highest mail bidder, opening bidding to the floor at an advance of from five to ten percent over the second highest bid. In the case of a single or no mail bidder on a lot, the opening bid shall be at the sole discretion of the auctioneer.
- 9. The auctioneer shall not be responsible for errors in mail bidding. When identical mail bids are submitted, preference goes to the first one received
- 10. Bids submitted by persons under 18 years of age will not be accepted.
- 11. All notes are guaranteed genuine. Successful bidders may request certification as to the authenticity of any lot. Auctioneer, at bidder's expense will forward the lot to a recognized authority for certification. Bidder must notify auctioneer of his intention to have a lot certified prior to taking possession of it. The auction is not an approval service, and all sales are to be considered final. All lots are available for viewing before the auction.
- 12. Grading is intended to follow normal standards with a conservative approach. However grading cannot be considered a precise science, and opinions may differ from individual to individual. We guarantee our professional best efforts to properly grade and describe all lots in this auction. We place our reputation and twenty five years experience on the line with every lot.
- 13. All sales to the floor are final with no returns. All invoices are scheduled to be mailed to the mail bidders within 72 hours of the auction, and payment must be made within five (5) days of receipt of the invoice. It is the responsibility of the bidder by mail to assure such payment or provide alternative arrangements in the event of circumstances which could cause a delay. Mail bidders will have five (5) days after receipt of the material to return any lots misgraded or misdescribed. Lots must be returned intact in the original holder unmolested. No lot may be returned for any reason after thirty days from the sale date.
- 14. We intend treating our clients as we ourselves would be treated. Any dispute that may arise can be resolved by reasonable negotiation. We *want* to be fair.
- 15. A 5% buyers fee will be added to the total invoiced amount.

#### **BIDDING BY MAIL**

Each lot is sold to the highest bidder. Every lot is unique and exists at the time of the sale, unless announced to be withdrawn prior to the actual sale. There are no back up or extra lots. In bidding by mail, it is possible to purchase a note at a price less than your maximum bid. You should consider your bids in this auction to be your limit rather than your bid.

With a floor sale scheduled, bids are recorded as they are received. At the close of the mail bidding, the highest and second highest bids are transferred to the bid book. On the floor of the auction, the bidding is opened at a five to ten percent advance over the second highest mail bid. This bid is submitted on behalf of the highest mail bidder. If the auctioneer recognizes no other bids from the floor, the highest mail bidder is awarded the lot at the opening bid regardless of the fact that his bid may be much higher. If the bidding proceeds from the floor, the auctioneer, acting as the mail bidder's agent, registers bids in standard increments over the previous bid. This process is continued until the mail bidder is awarded the lot, or until the next bid is higher than the mail bidder's maximum bid. For example: The highest mail bidder submits a bid of \$500.00: the second highest bid is \$300.00. In this case, bidding on the floor starts at \$325.00 and is bid by the auctioneer on behalf of the highest mail bidder. If no other bids are submitted by the floor, the highest mail bidder, who bid \$500.00, has purchased the lot for \$325.00. If other bids come from the floor, the auctioneer bids for the highest mail bidder in standard increments until the mail bidder's maximum bid of \$500.00 is reached. When or if the bidding from the floor has passed the mail bidder's maximum, the auctioneer will take no further action on behalf of the mail bidder, and the bidding will continue on the floor until the final purchaser has been recognized by the auctioneer. Using this procedure, the mail bidder retains many of the advantages of the floor bidder.

#### **RARITY**

The rarity ratings are based on the known notes in either large or small size series notes. This project began over twenty five years ago and has been contributed to by over 350 individuals and institutions. Approximately 135,000 notes have been recorded. The rarities are constantly changing as new notes are added to the census. This is an ongoing project and we appreciate the help we continue to receive. We all benefit from accuracy. The rarity scale is as follows:

- R6 None, one or two notes known to us
- R5 three, four or five notes known to us
- R4 six to eleven notes known to us
- R3 twelve to twenty four notes known to us
- R2 twenty five to fifty notes known to us
- R1 Over fifty notes known to us.

An asterisk (4\*) indicates that one or more uncut sheets are counted in the rarity for that bank.



Many of you know and remember A. P. "Del" Bertschy. For 80 of his 91 plus years he was interested in collecting coins and currency. He was a hobby booster and a 48-year member of the Milwaukee Numismatic Society, joining in 1940.

During his long affiliation with the society he served as President, Vice-President, and Trustee, and was probably best known for his duties as General Chairman and Bourse Chairman for many successful M.N.S. shows. We will all miss him wearing his famous fishing cap and selling tables for next year's "greater and better" show. For his dedication, the Milwaukee Numismatic Society awarded Del an honorary life membership many years ago and his contributions multiplied many fold ever since. It is thus fitting that a large portion of Del's currency collection be sold here at the M.N.S. show.

Del's tireless efforts to improve the hobby earned him awards from many organizations including N.O.W. and CSNS. He was named a Krause Numismatic Ambassador in 1978.

Del had a way of inspiring people to achieve more and making them feel good. He will be sorely missed by the collecting fraternity.

Del Bertschy's material is unusual in that most of it was obtained either from the banks where it was issued or deposited or from the people who themselves removed it from circulation. Del exercised both taste and discretion in making his selections, retaining only the top condition or the rarest material that came his way. We all have him to thank for saving a large number of notes from redemption. Quite properly he bequeathed his estate to his family and they will receive the numismatic premium from the sale of his currency. But in a larger sense all of us who admire and collect quality bank notes and other U.S. paper money are heirs to the magnificent legacy he left behind.

#### Introduction

Welcome to the third Hickman auction of the 1990s. This sale is being held in association with Dean Oakes Currency of Iowa City. We are very pleased to continue our new venture with such a distinguished collection as the remaining notes in the Del Bertschy estate. We begin this sale with his token collection of mostly civil war patriotic tokens and storecards. Many of his tokens are rarely available so collectors of exonumia should have a field day. Two rare Minnesota Civil War tokens will be found in the first part of the sale also. The selection of national bank notes from the upper midwest is truly outstanding. Over 75% of the notes have either never been available to collectors, or have not been available for many years. The quality of these notes is also remarkable. Note after note qualifies as one of the finest known from the bank that issued it. We have also included some very attractive obsolete notes, most of which were collected with agricultural vignettes and condition as the main consideration. We hope to include more of this type of material in the future. At the end of the national section the type notes remaining in the Del Bertschy estate are listed. Again, collectors are presented with an opportunity rarely available. Most of his material is in the "original" unmolested and unprocessed condition the way you like them. Canadian, Colonials, Souvenir cards, and bonds rarely seen are in this sale. A liberal assortment of bank post cards, books, price lists and catalogs round out the sale. This auction should offer something for every taste and purse. As in the previous forty auction catalogs I have been involved in, I hope you will find notes that will enhance your collection, gladden your heart, and leave your purse relatively intact. 34 \$20.00 1929 The FNB of Beardstown G-VG Charter #3640 #A000596A R 3. This is a well circulated specimen from a still surviving bank. F. M. Condit, whose signature as president can be found on this note, was promoted from cashier shortly before this note was issued. Seldom available and will likely realize about \$50.00.

35 \$20.00 1929 The St. Clair NB of Belleville AVF Charter #11478 #F000512A R 3. This bank was named for the southwest Illinois county where Belleville is the seat. This note is far above average condition for this bank and should well exceed \$50.00.



36 \$5.00 1902 The Canton NB

VG-F

Charter #3593 #18479-G R 5. This rare note has a slightly oily appearance, probably from a polyvinyl holder. It has bold clear signatures of H. Whitehead and E. A. Heald and is the only large size five we know of. We note that the last large size note that was available from this bank, a VF blue seal ten, was advertised @ \$650.00.

37 \$10.00 1929 The FNB of Chadwick AVG Charter #5619 #B000791A R 5. Chadwick must be included among the rare towns in Illinois from which to acquire a national bank note. We know of just three large and four small size notes including this specimen. The bottom border is somewhat ratty with a couple of small nicks. Still a very presentable note worthy of a liberal bid sure to exceed \$100.00.

38 \$5.00 1902 The FNB of Cuba VG Charter #11144 #17620-C R 5. This small bank issued only fives in large size and twenties in small size. We know of just four large and one small note. This should be a popular lot worthy of a liberal bid.

**39** \$5.00 1929 The FNB of De Land VG-F Charter #5699 #C000886A R 4. We know of no other fives from this small Piatt County bank. Likely to realize about \$35.00.

**40** \$20.00 1902 dates The Union NB of Elgin VG Charter #M-7236 #14309-B R 3. Evenly circulated and unmolested, but the signatures are almost gone. Still worth \$35.00 or more.

**41** \$10.00 1929 The Havana NB VG Charter #2242 #C000281A R 4. Two distinctive signatures of P. D. Dieffenbacher and C. P. King are on this note. Estimate: About \$50.

42 \$10.00 1929 The Hillsboro NB VG-F Charter #2789 #C000788A R 3. From Montgomery County seat in south central Illinois. Anthony Schindler and Geo. H. Fisher signatures. Scarce enough to realize \$50.00 or more.

**43** \$10.00 1929 The City NB of Kankakee VG-F Charter #4342 #E004446A R 1. A common note in a little above average condition. Should be worth a bid of \$20.00 or so.

44 \$3.00 1839 Bank of Cairo, Kaskaskia VG Obsolete #5304-A Haxby G16 printed by Underwood, Bald, Spencer and Holts. Whole and clean for the grade. An allegorical figure is seated in the foreground, with two boats in the background traversing the river. Catalog value: \$50.00.

**45** \$5.00 1902 The German-American NB of Lincoln F Charter #M-3613 #9518-B R 4. This note is almost an exact duplicate of Lot 159 in our June auction. It realized \$84.00.



46 \$5.00 1929 The American NB of Lincoln F+ Charter #3613 #B005927A R 5. The right denomination to pair with the note above with the original title, and a prized item for Lincoln collectors

47 \$10.00 1929 The Lincoln NB VG-F Charter #3369 #F002572A R 3. Not as nice or as rare but still attractive. Bid your pleasure.

48 \$10.00 1929 The Dulaney NB of Marshall VG Charter #4759 #B001594A R 4. A private name bank with the signature of H. B. Dulaney as president. Likely to exceed \$50.00.

**49** \$10.00 1929 The FNB of Ottawa VG Charter #1154 #E004226A R 3. From LaSalle County in northern Illinois. Well worth a \$35.00 bid.

50 \$5.00 1902 The American NB of Pekin 98% VG-F Charter #3770 #9687-C R 4. The other 2% is the missing upper left corner about half way through the counter. Bid your pleasure.

**51** \$5.00 1929 type two The American NB of Pekin VG Charter #3770 #A002992 R 3, just three of which are type two fives, always popular. Estimate: \$35.00+.

52 \$10.00 1902 The Farmers NB of Pekin F Charter #M-2287 #673-C R 3. Second charter notes are more common than third charter notes from this bank. This attractive specimen will likely approach \$100.00.

53 \$20.00 1929 The Farmers NB of Pekin F Charter #2287 #D000236A R 5. Three twenties, a ten and a five in the census. This is the next finest of the group, and a very nice match with the blue seal ten. Est: \$100.00.

54 \$50.00 1929 Commercial Merchants NB & Tr Co of Peoria AVF Charter #3296 #A001516A R 3, made up of fifties and hundreds only. This is the fourth title used by this charter. Estimate: \$75.00 or so.

55 \$5.00 1902 The FNB of Savanna F Charter #M-8540  $\rm \ddot{r}7275\text{-F}$  R 4. This a rare denomination for this northwest Illinois bank. Signatures : L. H. & C. K. Miles. Should approach \$100.00.

 $\bf 56$   $\,$  \$10.00  $\,$  1929 The FNB of Savanna  $\,$  F Charter #8540 #F000923A R 4. A nice match with signatures of C. N. Jenks and Lawrence Miles. This note is likely to realize about \$50.00.

57 \$1.00 184- The State Bank of Illinois, Springfield F Obsolete unsigned remainder. Haxby II-775 Design 1A. This is a handsome note with a portrait of Washington in the left vignette, A pair of horses and a farmer plowing with a boat and a house in the background in the center vignette, and a woman seated among harvest crops in the right vignette. Unpriced but similar material suggest a fair estimate of about \$20.00.

58 \$10.00 1929 The FNB of Waverly VG-F Charter #6116 #E000630A R 4. This note is from Waverly's only national bank and one of only four banks in Morgan County in west central Illinois. Seldom available in small size and should realize about \$100.00.

**58-c** ILLINOIS BANK POST CARDS, including FNB of Bridgeport, Carbondale(3), Chicago NB, Corn Exch NB (2), FNB of Chicago (12), Millikin of Decatur, FNB of Dundee, Harrisburg NB, FNB of Peoria, Salem NB (2) State B of Salem and FNB of Urbana. The Bridgeport is B & W, and the Salem cards are real photos. 27 cards in the lot. Should be worth about \$50.00.

- **59** \$20.00 1929 The Farmers NB of Aurelia VG-F Charter #9724 #B000421A R 4. This bank lasted a hundred years through wars and depressions only to be among the first to go under in the farm crisis of the 1980s. There are seven small size notes in the census, four tens and three twenties. This honest note is likely to exceed \$50.00.
- **60** \$10.00 1929 type two The FNB of Aurelia F Charter #7108 #A000187 R 4. This note is a better type, a little nicer, and a little rarer by one note, with fewer notes issued. Estimate: \$75.00+
- **61** \$10.00 1929 The Bedford NB G-VG Charter #5165 #C000425A R 4. This well circulated note is one of five tens in the census. From Taylor County in SW Iowa. Should realize \$35.00+.
- **62** \$10.00 1902 The FNB of Boone VG Charter #M-3273 #9045-D R 3. There are an even dozen blue seal tens recorded, mostly in similar condition to this one. Worth a bid of \$35.00+.
- 63 \$10.00 1902 The FNB of Britt Soiled VG Charter #5020 #1809-C. R 4 with the addition of this well circulated specimen. This town is famous for it's Hobo convention. A King and Queen are selected annually to reign over the hobos. It's hard to remember the last time a Britt note was available. Even in worn condition this note will probable realize \$75.00 or more.




