

With this auction, we have followed the lead of others in the auction field and have reluctantly increased our buyer's fee to 10 %. Additionally we have lowered our commission rates accordingly. It should be obvious to everyone that better material is in strong hands and is very difficult to obtain and that these adjustments are designed to encourage the flow of material that is beneficial to us all. This sale also includes an assortment of nationals, colonials, fractionals, errors, and other United States currency at mostly modest prices. As in the previous forty four auction catalogs I have been involved in, I hope that you will find material that will enhance your collection, gladden your heart, and leave your purse relatively intact. TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SALE

To give all bidders an equal opportunity, bids will not be opened until the closing date of the sale. In other words, we will not know ourselves, and therefore cannot reveal, where the high bid is until the sale is over. To help us segregate bids from our regular mail, we are providing envelopes for use only for the mail bid sale. Please mark any other envelope you may use on the outside so that we can know it is a bid. Skeptics are invited to inspect the unopened bids up to the closing date. To insure that your efforts are not wasted, mail your bids in early. We will be pleased to discuss and further describe any of the lots by phone,, but we must insist that telephone bids be confirmed in writing sent before the deadline. Fax and overnight letters are acceptable. All bids will be opened June 23, 1993.

- 1. Each lot will be sold to the highest bidder unreserved at a slight advance over the next highest bid. In the event of identical bids, the earliest postmark will receive the lot.
- 2. As in all legitimate auctions, the second highest bidder will set the price. Up to the \$1000.00 level, advances will be ten per cent with a \$50.00 maximum. At \$1000.00 and over, advances will be 5%. This method will permit a bidder to make a liberal bid with the assurance that his bid will be reduced to the indicated amount above the next highest bid. In cases where only one bid is received, the estimate will be used as the underbid. You should consider your bids in this auction to be your limit rather than your bid.
- 3. All lots are guaranteed genuine and as described. Please be sure you are bidding the correct amount on the proper lot. Only signed written bids are acceptable. These bids are a binding contractual offer on your part.
- 4. All successful bidders must remit payment immediately upon receipt of invoice and/or lots. The cost of packing, postage and insurance will be added to the invoices. Lots delivered in lowa are subject to state sales tax of 5 % unless a resale number is given.
- 5. All photographs are of the actual lots being sold.
- 6. Prices or estimates given reflect the opinion of the cataloger as to what the lots should or probably will bring. Higher rather than lower valuations are expected to prevail. We reserve the right to reject bids of less than 60 % of the estimates.
- 7. Alternate and limited bids are acceptable. These can be handled much more efficiently in a sealed bid auction. No buy or unlimited bids are acceptable. Bids of uneven dollar amounts will be lowered to even dollar amounts.
- 8. GRADING is intended to follow normal standards with a conservative approach. However grading cannot be considered a precise science, and opinions may differ from individual to individual. We guarantee our professional best efforts to properly grade and describe all the lots in this auction. We place our reputation and twenty five years experience on the line with every lot.
- 9. All invoices are scheduled to be mailed to the bidders within 72 hours of the close of the auction, and payment must be made within five (5) days of receipt of the invoice. It is the responsibility of the bidder to assure such payment or provide alternative arrangements in the event of circumstances which could cause a delay. Bidders will have five (5) after receipt of the material to return any lots misgraded or misdescribed. Lots must be returned intact in the original holder unmolested. No lots may be returned for any reason after thirty days from the sale date.
- 10. We intend treating our clients as we ourselves would be treated. Any dispute that may arise can be resolved by reasonable negotiation. We WANT to be fair.
- 11. A 10% buyers fee will be added to the total invoiced amount.

RARITY

The rarity ratings are based on the known notes in either large or small size series notes. This project began over twenty five years ago and has been contributed to by over 350 individuals and institutions. Approximately 140,000 notes have been recorded. The rarities are constantly changing as new notes are added to the census. This is an ongoing project and we appreciate the help we continue to receive. We all benefit from accuracy. The rarity scale is as follows:

- R6 None, one or two notes known to us
- R5 three, four or five notes known to us
- R4 six to eleven notes known to us
- R3 twelve to twenty four notes known to us
- R2 twenty five to fifty notes known to us
- R1 Over fifty notes known to us.

An asterisk (4*) indicates that one or more uncut sheets are counted in the rarity for that bank.

Lot 24, the Fr 321 1891 \$20.00 silver certificate with serial number *5265B turned out to be one of the most hotly contested notes we've ever handled. This one slipped by me until after the catalog was printed. So many of the early types have an asterisk that is only a printer's symbol and not an indication of being a replacement note that I didn't realize that this was only the fourth star note of this series to be reported. It received numerous liberal bids including a significant increase over an already very high bid and was finally hammered down at \$2830.00. This proves that a good note will find a home at a significant price level even without the promotion and ballyhoo that is so common with notes with claims to rarity. The counterfeit \$5.00 FCP on the Traders National Bank of Chicago, Lot 249 and the Mount Pleasant, Pennsylvania Lazy Two, Lot 470 both received a great deal of attention and realized important prices. Over 150 bidders were successful in acquiring one or more lots. If the lots with \$ only, which received no acceptable bids of 50 to 60% of the estimates are deducted along with the lots that were misdescribed and withdrawn, the distribution of the remaining lots is very well dispersed. The art work did very well for the first time out, with the bidding concentrated on the more attractive and popular pieces. Our future auctions will offer more of this type of material.

We are presently negotiating to conduct a Saturday afternoon floor auction at the February Long Beach show and if we are successful we hope to bring another exciting paper money auction to the West coast. We don't expect to reach the level of participation of our Krakover auction in 1990, but with a little luck and cooperation we will make it a memorable event. We invite your participation and we particularly want to include as much material from West of the Mississippi river as possible.
