












Introduction

Welcome to our eighth auction of the 1990s. I am very proud to continue our series of auctions with another outstanding selection of National Bank notes and related material. For this auction we are providing you with the number of notes in our data base for each bank represented in the sale. Over nearly thirty years we have recorded almost 150,000 nationals with the co-operation of over 350 individuals. We feel that the known number of surviving notes is significant information to the collector in reaching a decision regarding the acquisition of notes. We have always felt that the main difference in rarity is that a common note can be acquired in the grade, denomination and price suitable to the collector, whereas a scarce or rare note may not be available in the grade or denomination desired. We would say generally speaking, that four notes or less known would be a good measure for serious consideration of the note available. The number of notes known to have survived has a direct relationship to the frequency of availability and of course the price of the note. Consider the data as a road map. It wont tell you the grades or denominations but knowing the number of known surviving notes will be helpful to you in developing your strategy on which of the notes you desire to pursue first. This auction has exceptional selections from Massachusetts and Pennsylvania and some very interesting related material which we feel will enhance a collection that includes nationals. As in the previous forty five auction catalogs I have been involved in, I hope that you will find material that will enhance your collection, gladden your heart, and leave your purse relatively intact. I wish you all, Happy Hunting!

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SALE

To give all bidders an equal opportunity, bids will not be opened until the closing date of the sale. In other words, we will not know ourselves, and therefore cannot reveal, where the high bid is until the sale is over. To help us segregate bids from our regular mail, we are providing envelopes for use only for the mail bid sale. Please mark any other envelope you may use on the outside so that we can know it is a bid. Skeptics are invited to inspect the unopened bids up to the closing date. To insure that your efforts are not wasted, mail your bids in early. We will be pleased to discuss and further describe any of the lots by phone,, but we must insist that telephone bids be confirmed in writing sent before the deadline. Fax and overnight letters are acceptable. All bids will be opened June 22, 1994.

- 1. Each lot will be sold to the highest bidder unreserved at a slight advance over the next highest bid. In the event of identical bids, the earliest postmark will receive the lot.
- 2. As in all legitimate auctions, the second highest bidder will set the price. Up to the \$1000.00 level, advances will be ten per cent with a \$50.00 maximum. At \$1000.00 and over, advances will be 5%. This method will permit a bidder to make a liberal bid with the assurance that his bid will be reduced to the indicated amount above the next highest bid. In cases where only one bid is received, the estimate will be used as the underbid. You should consider your bids in this auction to be your limit rather than your bid.
- 3. All lots are guaranteed genuine and as described. Please be sure you are bidding the correct amount on the proper lot. Only signed written bids are acceptable. These bids are a binding contractual offer on your part.
- 4. All successful bidders must remit payment immediately upon receipt of invoice and/or lots. The cost of packing, postage and insurance will be added to the invoices. Lots delivered in lowa are subject to state sales tax of 5 % unless a resale number is given.
- 5. All photographs are of the actual lots being sold.
- 6. Prices or estimates given reflect the opinion of the cataloger as to what the lots should or probably will bring. Higher rather than lower valuations are expected to prevail. We reserve the right to reject bids of less than 60 % of the estimates.
- 7. Alternate and limited bids are acceptable. These can be handled much more efficiently in a sealed bid auction. No buy or unlimited bids are acceptable. Bids of uneven dollar amounts will be lowered to even dollar amounts.
- 8. GRADING is intended to follow normal standards with a conservative approach. However grading cannot be considered a precise science, and opinions may differ from individual to individual. We guarantee our professional best efforts to properly grade and describe all the lots in this auction. We place our reputation and twenty five years experience on the line with every lot.
- 9. All invoices are scheduled to be mailed to the bidders within 72 hours of the close of the auction, and payment must be made within five (5) days of receipt of the invoice. It is the responsibility of the bidder to assure such payment or provide alternative arrangements in the event of circumstances which could cause a delay. Bidders will have five (5) after receipt of the material to return any lots misgraded or misdescribed. Lots must be returned intact in the original holder unmolested. No lots may be returned for any reason after thirty days from the sale date.
- 10. We intend treating our clients as we ourselves would be treated. Any dispute that may arise can be resolved by reasonable negotiation. We WANT to be fair.
- 11. A 10% buyers fee will be added to the total invoiced amount.

RARITY

The rarity ratings are based on the known notes in either large or small size series notes. This project began over twenty five years ago and has been contributed to by over 350 individuals and institutions. Approximately 150,000 notes have been recorded. The rarities are constantly changing as new notes are added to the census. This is an ongoing project and we appreciate the help we continue to receive. We all benefit from accuracy. The rarity scale is as follows:

- R6 None, one or two notes known to us
- R5 three, four or five notes known to us
- R4 six to eleven notes known to us
- R3 twelve to twenty four notes known to us
- R2 twenty five to fifty notes known to us
- R1 Over fifty notes known to us.

An asterisk (4°) indicates that one or more uncut sheets are counted in the rarity for that bank.

 This is a document certifying the truth of transcripts from the books and proceedings of the Treasury. It is signed by Thomas L. Smith Register, and Walter Forward, Secretary of the Treasury and is affixed with the official seal of the his Department. These two officials served under John Tyler, who became President upon the death of William Henry Harrison. Aside from being mended at the center fold, this document is in very fine condition and could easily be framed as a decorative historic artifact. Worth?
- 4 1876 Annual Report of the Comptroller of the Currency This 778 page volume contains balance sheets on every National Bank with the names of the President and Cashier as of October 31, 1876 along with the circulation outstanding and a wealth of other information. The index of towns at the back lists all national bank communities then in existence. This is a treasure for the serious student, and the as new state of preservation is remarkable. (\$150.00)

- 8 \$1.00 4 % Consolidated Bond Coupon due April 1st, 1885 # 25933 Fine. Portrait of Daniel Webster with the signature of John Allison. This coupon represents three months interest on the par value (\$100.00) of the bond. Rare. Worth?
- 9 \$1000.00 The Peoples Money, Absolutely Irredeemable Money # 986,548.720,895,674 Fine. This is one of the most interesting of the satirical notes that were current in the 1870's when the Greenback party was agitating for currency reform. It features the infamous Benjamin F. Butler on both sides. (\$75.00)



- 10 \$1000.00 Absolute Money Washington City, July 24th, 1880 Series 59,843,702,086,231,987 AU. This is a much rarer item than the last. Redeemable nowhere, in nothing, and by nobody. Burn the bonds, Shoot the bondholder. The poor man's money. The more a man has of it, the poorer he is. Uncle Sam vignette cranking out an endless roll of currency at right. Worth as much or more than the last.
- 11 \$1.00 Legal Tender facsimile with greenback propaganda 5478243 CU. " LET ONLY THE NATIONAL GOVERNMENT ISSUE OUR MONEY-BURN THE BONDS- PAY THEM ALL IN GREENBACKS-BOUNCE THE NATIONAL BANKER. Seymour Warner printed on the back. This item is the size of a business card and was printed by Bufford in Boston. (About \$50.00)
- 12 1 Co-operative Commonwealth IOU Co-op Buck Signed Soke. D. Public and E. Z. Pickins." This certifies that we think everybody should pay taxes except us co-ops" Fairly modern anti-co-op propaganda note, approximately current dollar size. Pastel colored central vignette and green back. Your bid?

Political

13 Democratic National Reform Ticket, 1876 AU Samuel J. Tilden of New York. This was a very significant election in American history. Even though Tilden received a quarter million more votes and 184 to 163 uncontested electoral votes, there were 22 uncounted votes from Oregon and three southern states. An electoral commission gave all the uncounted votes and the election to Hayes. As a concession to Tilden's patriotism in avoiding civil strife, the Union troops were removed from several southern states, Tilden's running mate was Thomas A. Hendricks of Indiana whose portrait can be found on the 1886 "Tombstone" \$10.00 silver certificates, Fr 291-304. Worth?

- 14 Greenback Labor Ticket Third Congressional District 1880 James B. Weaver for President AU. This item, like the last and the next are uniface currency sized listings of the party's candidates for President, Vice President, Congress, Electors at large and District Electors. These listings are the origin of the political "Ticket". Weaver ran again in 1892 on the People's Ticket when he received over a million votes and 22 electoral votes. A worthy companion to the green back propaganda notes. Neat arm and hammer vignette, Worth?
- 15 Republican Ticket, Third Congressional District of Virginia James A. Garfield for President VF. This is the ticket for 1880 that defeated Weaver and after the death of Garfield, his running mate Chester A. Arthur became president. This ticket is shorter than the others being about 3/5 their size. A great display item to tie-in with the five dollar brownback or political ephemera. Worth?
- 16 Republican Ticket Sixth Congressional District, 1888
 Benjamin Harrison for President CU. This district included the
 Maryland Counties of Allegany, Garrett, Washington,
 Frederick and Montgomery. Another neat currency tie-in since
 Harrison was elected and his portrait appears on all the 1902
 series five dollar notes. Worth?
- 17 Republican National Convention Guest Ticket, Sixth Day only June 7th, 1916 Chicago. Two stubs are attached for the first and second session. National Capital and liberty vignettes. A very attractive item. This was the convention that nominated Charles Evans Hughes to oppose Woodrow Wilson. The night of the election he retired for the evening convinced he had been elected. CU (\$75.00)
- 18 Democratic National Convention Guest Ticket, Fourth Session June, 1928, Houston, Texas. The Coliseum is illustrated on the back, with oval vignettes of Jefferson, Jackson, Cleveland and Wilson on the face, along with the national capital. Stub for entrance 12 is attached. This was the convention that nominated Al Smith to oppose Herbert Hoover. AU. (\$50.00)
- 19 Republican National Convention Guest First Day only June 14, 1932. This ticket is for the first balcony. A circular vignette of Washington is at left. This convention nominated Herbert Hoover for a second tern. An exercise in futility. Uncirculated. (\$35.00)
- 20 As above Guest Ticket for the Second Day, this one is for the mezzanine. (\$35.00)
- 21 Democratic National Convention Honored Guest ticket for admission to the floor. Philadelphia, June, 1936. Roosevelt oval at right. Stub for Franklin Field attached. VF. (\$35.00)
- 22 \$1.00 Dewey-Warren Certificates, Philadelphia 1948 # 115951-115958 Uncirculated. Booklet of eight numbered certificates, complete with stubs and green cover. Two certificates have been removed from the back. This campaign was considered to be a cinch for the republicans but Harry Truman fooled the experts and won. (\$100.00)

- 23 Inaugural Ceremonies January 20th, 1965 Invitation and program with portraits of Lyndon B. Johnson and Hubert H. Humphrey with their signatures reproduced below. # 686 Section H. As new. The program is bound with a red, white and blue ribbon and has an embossed gold eagle on the cover. Congress of the United States in scrip on the envelope. Worth to you?
- 24 Inaugural Ceremonies January 20th, 1973 invitation and program with portraits of Richard M. Nixon and Spiro Agnew in the official envelope stamped Congress of the United States. Similar to previous lot. As new. Your bid?

- 25 Coin Post Cards from Mexico and Switzerland The coin designs are embossed in actual size and full color. All current coins circa 1905 are included. The national flag is also illustrated. The Swiss card includes the exchange rate for ten different countries. Plus a similar contemporary card with the postage stamps of Mexico. All three are unmailed and in as made condition. (\$50.00)
- 26 State trade cards issued by Arbuckle's Ariosa Coffee circa 1889. 46 pieces including Alaska, Arizona, District of Columbia, Indian Territory and New Mexico, but missing Alabama, Missouri, South Carolina and Washington. 

- 49 Fr 96 \$10.00 1869 United States "Rainbow" Note Choice CU # H4265218". This is the original "Jackass" note with Allison-Spinner signatures and the large red seal. This note is the only one in the series with the ornate back referred to as Design No. 15 in Friedberg. We think this note is in that category, it's that nice. This is the Teehee-Burke signature combination. Houston B. Teehee grew up in the Cherokee District of the Indian Territory. His father served in the Union army during the War between the States. His name was Di-Hi-Hi," Killer" in the Cherokee language. Finding the name difficult to pronounce, his fellow soldiers dubbed him Teehee and the name stuck. His son remains the only native American whose name appears on our currency. Running Antelope was a Chief of the Hunkpapa Dakota Sioux. He is shown on this note wearing a Pawnee war bonnet, placed there by the engraver, G. F. C. Smillie. making this note the most native American of all our currency. (\$1000.00 ++)
