Todd Lloyd is a senior policy associate within the Annie E. Casey Foundation's External Affairs division and the Child Welfare and Juvenile Justice Policy Unit. In his role, he coordinates national policy and advocacy initiatives, offers consultation to state child welfare systems, and supports various grantmaking efforts aimed at enhancing child welfare and foster care policy and programs on both state and national levels. With a 25-year career in the child welfare field, Mr. Lloyd began as a county child welfare caseworker and later oversaw Adolescent Services, contributing to the development of Chafee independent living services for youth transitioning from foster care. With a strong foundation in policy analysis, community organizing, and storytelling, Shaquita works to elevate the needs of young people and families and promote evidence-informed solutions that expand opportunity and improve long-term outcomes. In her role, Shaquita collaborates with policymakers, partners, and stakeholders to shape federal initiatives that enhance access to critical support services — including extended foster care, housing, and workforce stability — and to ensure that youth voices are embedded in policy design and implementation. Shaquita's work reflects a deep commitment to transforming the narrative around child welfare and the human service workforce, advocating for policies that empower resilience, equity, and success for young people and families.

Rachel Rosenberg, PhD, MSW, is a senior research scientist in Child Trends' child welfare research area whose work focuses on improving outcomes for young people transitioning out of foster care. She specializes in quantitative, qualitative, and mixed methods research, youth and community engagement, and translating research into practice. Dr. Rosenberg leads major evaluation partnerships, including work with the Annie E. Casey Foundation and the National Center for Youth Law, and has published peer-reviewed research and practitioner-focused reports to strengthen services for older youth in foster care. She has briefed Congress, responded to media requests, and presented at national, state, and local conferences. She holds a PhD in social work from Virginia Commonwealth University, an MSW from the University of Kentucky, and a bachelor's degree in political science from Eastern Kentucky University.
